2022 Pacific Northwest Student Symposium



Overview

Good faith participation in the ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by at least one (1) member of the ASCE Student Chapter, is a requirement to advance to an ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals. The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career.

The topic for the Student Paper Competition is the <u>Daniel Mead Prize for Students Topic</u>.

The event is judged based on:

- 1. A technical paper;
- 2. An oral presentation.

Technical papers must be submitted by **April 1st, 2022 at 11:59 pm PDT**. The day of the competition will take place in an online format; platform details and event breakdown will be released with Mailer V.

Technical Paper

All documents will be scored on originality, adherence to topic, spelling & grammar, clarity, quality, and overall adherence to competition rules.

Technical papers shall be no longer than 2,000 words in length, excluding the cover letter and references. The single .pdf submission shall include a cover letter from the Faculty Advisor stating the name, ASCE/AEI member ID number, mailing address, phone number, and e-mail address for the paper's author, as well as the student paper. Student papers shall be submitted to ubc.asce@gmail.com by April 1st, 2022 at 11:59 pm PDT.

Oral Presentation

All competitors will be asked to give a five-minute oral presentation about the student paper and a slide deck for visuals (e.g. PowerPoint) followed by a Q&A session. The slide deck will not need to be submitted.
