PACKING INFORMATION

Housing Info

On-campus housing will be provided for student competitors at Fairmont State University. Traditional and suite-style residence hall options will be available.

Traditional Residence Halls (Pence Hall and Prichard Hall)

The first men's residence hall built on Fairmont State's campus, Pence Hall joined our community in 1957. Updated to modern standards and opened to all residents, Pence Hall is now one of our three traditional-style living options. Prichard Hall is a traditional-style residence hall featuring double rooms and community-style restrooms located on each wing. Each room is equipped with an individual air conditioning unit, allowing students to control their desired room temperature.

Suite-Style Residence Hall (University Terrace and Bryant Place)

University Terrace offers state-of-the-art, apartment-style living spaces and suites (studio single, double suites and quad apartments). That allows you to enjoy the community and benefits of living on campus while also enjoying more privacy and personal space. All units are furnished. Bryant Place is one of our newest residence halls, offering a modern facility with suite-style rooms. Living here, you will find the community of the more traditional residence halls combined with a more individual living space. Suite-style housing includes private bathroom facilities and a shared common area between just a few residents. Each suite contains four beds, two sinks, one common area, one shower room, and one restroom facility.

Additional Housing Information

All residence hall rooms include air conditioning.

All rooms include a Twin XL bed, desk with chair, and wardrobe.

All buildings offer community lounge areas.

Students will be issued a key card to access the residence halls. Some rooms may also require a physical metal key.

Any lost or unreturned keys or key cards will result in additional charges.
(\$150.00 per physical key and \$20.00 per key card)

Damages to the residence halls will not be tolerated. Damages will result in additional charges to the student assigned to the room.

Fairmont State will provide each room with a pillow, bed linens (sheets, pillowcase, blanket), and bathroom linens (towel, washcloth, bathmat). *We are **NOT** providing any toiletries or toilet paper. You will need to bring your own or purchase them.* If you would like to use the kitchens or common areas to cook, please bring your own utensils and kitchenware. It is the responsibility of each occupant to clean up after themselves in the kitchens if they are used.

Items not Permitted

For health and safety reasons the following items are not permitted in student rooms. Failure to comply with these restrictions may result in the item being confiscated and will be considered a student conduct matter.

- Security cameras
- Free weights over 20 lbs. (all weights under 20 lbs. must be housed on a mat)
- Electric devices such as hot plates, toasters, ovens, popcorn poppers, air conditioners, electric grills, portable heaters, sandwich makers, crock pots, rice cookers, air fryers etc.
- Alcohol, drugs, alcohol or drug paraphernalia, empty alcohol containers (even for decoration)
- Microwaves (except Micro-Fridges rented through our contact)
- Any open-flame object (e.g., candles or incense, even unlit) and candle warmers with hot plates
- Drums, amplification equipment for stereos, electric guitars, etc.
- Weapons or fireworks
- Gasoline, lighter fluid, charcoal grills, or any combustible, explosive, or flammable material

- Pets of any kind, except for a fish in tank (no more than 10 gallons)
- Supplies used to stack or loft beds
- Bed risers
- Weapons of any sort including but not limited to paintball, BB, or pellet guns
- Wireless routers
- Extension cords or multi-outlet adapters
- Motorbikes, Segways, Hoverboards, e-scooters etc.
- Anything, including but not limited to decorations, attached to light fixtures, fire equipment, etc.
- Anything in the windowsill facing outside the window including items hanging in/on the window.
- Surge protectors, holiday lights, etc. are permitted, but may not be plugged into one another; commonly known as piggy-backed or daisy-chained

Necessary Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Concrete Canoe: Please note that all paddlers are required to wear a US Coast Guard-approved inherently buoyant (no inflatables) Type I, II, or III Personal Floatation Device (life jacket) while in a canoe during competition per ASCE regulations. ***It is also recommended to bring protective water shoes. Tygart Lake is a recreational lake known for its fishing opportunities. Expect discarded fishing accessories to be present at the race site, which can harm bare feet.*** Please bring additional floatation and repair materials to prepare for the unlikely event that your canoe is involved in an accident. Materials will not be provided, and your canoe must pass a swamp test to race.

Sustainable Solutions: For those participating in the field trip to Valley Falls State Park, participants should wear closed-toe shoes appropriate for hiking and uneven terrain. We also strongly recommend ensuring your team has sunscreen, water, and weather appropriate clothing, as portions of the trip will take place outdoors with limited shade. These items will not be provided by Fairmont State University or by WV State Parks. Cellular service is extremely limited or unavailable at Valley Falls State Park.

Please use general hiking safety practices, including staying on designated trails, being mindful of slippery rocks and uneven surfaces, and remaining with your group throughout the excursion.

UESI Surveying: All team members are required to wear closed-toe shoes and either a safety vest or high-visibility shirt (construction or high-visibility yellow, orange, pink, blue, red, or green) while completing the field tasks portion of the competition.

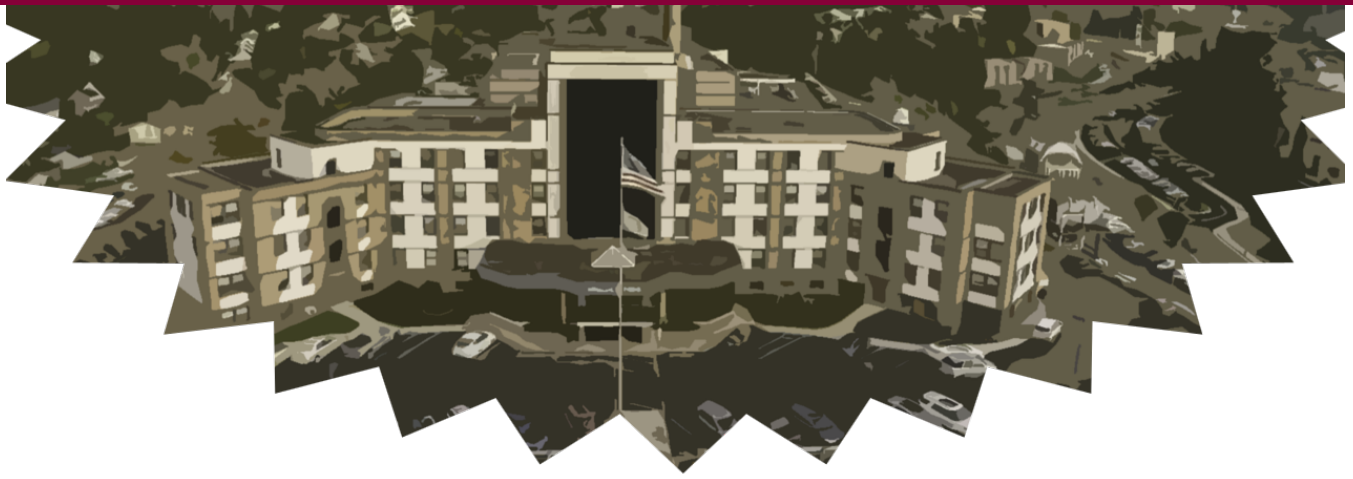

Due to the scale of the event, it is imperative that each participant look out for their personal safety and the safety of those around them. In the event of a medical emergency, first aid tents will be stationed at every CESC official event. In the event of a major medical emergency, please do not hesitate to call 911, and send someone to get help from a first aid tent. If you are unable to find a first aid tent, please alert a volunteer and they will direct you to the appropriate location.

In the event of any minor incidents, please find a volunteer who can help alleviate the situation or can contact our safety personnel during the CESC. In the event of a competition emergency, contact a volunteer at the safety tent. There will be safety tents set up at each location for outdoor/field activities. If you need to contact campus police for non-emergencies, see their contact information below. If there is an emergency, call 911.

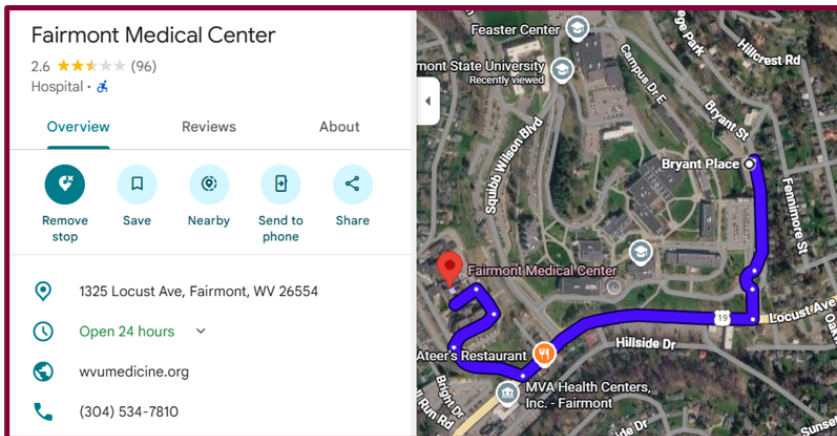

In the event of an emergency, a GroupMe message will be sent to all attendees with important information, including instructions on where to go and relevant details about the situation.

Alcohol & Drug Policies

Fairmont State's campus and the ASCE Civil Engineering Student Championships are alcohol & drug free. Alcohol and drugs are strictly PROHIBITED on campus and at any CESC event. Please also note that smoking or the use of e-cigarettes is NOT allowed on campus and all buildings are smoke-free areas.

Firearms

The American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) prohibits weapons of any kind—including firearms, explosives, and knives—at all of its sponsored events, meetings, and conferences.

Sexual Misconduct

Fairmont State will not tolerate, in any manner, any sexual assault on campus or at any campus-related facility. We strive to maintain a safe environment for all persons who participate in any Fairmont State activity. Violators will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

Team Tents

During events with extended sun exposure, some tents will be provided for shade. Teams can and are encouraged to set up canopies/popup tents during extended outdoor events. Weather conditions during the Championships are anticipated to include high heat and humidity, and prolonged exposure may be harmful. Tents during the Concrete Canoe display and races must stay within the designated team spaces, and tents set up during UESI Surveying field tasks must not interfere with the competition.

However, it is essential to note that teams are not allowed to have gas stoves under or near their tents at any time. Additionally, tents must be securely fastened down at all times as teams will be responsible for all subsequent damage.

General Notice

CESC participants are guests on Fairmont State University's campus for the duration of the CESC. Summer classes and other student-led programs will be in session, and participants are expected to respect campus policies and others who will be sharing the campus during this time.

Any conduct determined disrespectful or disruptive on campus will lead to the dismissal of all those involved. Fairmont's planning team has made great efforts to minimize interactions with these other groups for your comfort and ask for your assistance in keeping Fairmont State University a safe space for all.

West Virginia State Park Policies (Tygart and Valley Falls)

The following rules and regulations are maintained in consideration of our guests and to protect resources within West Virginia State Parks and State Forests. Please be sure that all members of your party are aware of these guidelines prior to arrival. While this abridged listing does not include all regulations pertaining to activities in state parks and forests, it does address some of the more common questions and concerns. Full lists of rules and regulations are posted at each park area.

Unlawful Acts in State Parks and State Forests include (but are not limited to) the following:

- Destroying, defacing, disturbing or removing any part of any building, sign, structure or equipment.
- Destroying, cutting, breaking, removing, defacing, mutilating, injuring, taking or gathering any tree, shrub, other plant or plant part, rock, mineral, or geological feature except by permit issued by the Division.
- Failure to pay for rental charges or other fees required for park and facility use.
- All fires must be confined to designated grills or areas.
- Hunting, trapping or other harassment of wildlife.
- Feeding wildlife.
- Acting in a disorderly manner or creating any noise which would result in annoyance to others.
- Littering and/or dumping any refuse or waste, including grey water, from any trailer or other vehicle except in places or receptacles provided for such use.
- Dogs and cats are the only pets permitted in state parks and forests. Pets must be leashed and restrained.
- Explosives, incendiaries, flammables and other dangerous substances are prohibited in state parks, state forests.
- Hawking, peddling, soliciting, begging, advertising, or carrying on any business or commercial enterprise is prohibited in state parks, and state forests without the written permission of the Director of the Division of Natural Resources.
- Operating vehicles in a reckless manner, or in excess of posted speed limits, or in areas other than those specifically intended for vehicular traffic.
- Quiet hours are observed from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Weather & Nature Notice

Fairmont, West Virginia experiences warm and often humid weather in late June. Typical daytime temperatures range from 75-85°F, while overnight temperatures generally fall into the 55-65°F range. While extended periods of hot weather are possible, mornings and evenings are often comfortable. Layering is recommended, particularly for participants who will be outdoors throughout the day.

One thing to know about West Virginia is that the weather can change quickly. It is not uncommon to experience sunshine, clouds, and a passing rain shower all within the same day. Participants are encouraged to pack sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat, comfortable clothing, and a light rain jacket or poncho. Even on cloudy days, UV exposure can be significant, especially during extended outdoor activities.

Many event activities will take place outdoors, including at Tygart Lake and Valley Falls State Park. Participants should plan for prolonged exposure to the sun and should bring a reusable water bottle to stay hydrated throughout the event.

In addition to the weather, visitors should be prepared for West Virginia's terrain. The Mountain State earned its nickname honestly. Fairmont State University's campus, Tygart Lake, and Valley Falls State Park all feature significant hills, uneven ground, and abrupt elevation changes. Walking between venues may involve steep sidewalks, stairs, and inclines. Participants should pack comfortable footwear and be prepared for more walking and elevation change than they may be accustomed to on a typical college campus. Around here, "Stairmont State" is more than just a nickname.

West Virginia's mountains, forests, and waterways are home to a variety of wildlife. While encounters are uncommon, participants may see deer, wild turkeys, turtles, snakes, or other native species during outdoor activities. Those visiting wooded or grassy areas should be mindful of ticks and use insect repellent when appropriate. Please stay on designated trails and avoid approaching or feeding wildlife.

For those participating in activities at Valley Falls State Park, be aware that trails may contain uneven terrain, exposed roots, wet rocks, and steep slopes. Closed-toe shoes suitable for hiking are strongly recommended. The waterfalls and scenery are well worth the effort, but proper footwear is essential.

Finally, cell phone service can be limited in some areas of West Virginia, particularly at Valley Falls State Park, Tygart Lake State Park, and in other remote locations. Participants should plan accordingly and make arrangements in advance if they anticipate needing reliable cellular service during their visit.

West Virginia weather has a personality of its own, and so does its terrain. Come prepared for a little bit of everything, and you'll fit right in. 🏞️ ☀️ 🌧️ 🧥

Internet & Technology

For all events that occur on Fairmont State's campus, a guest wireless internet network is available for use. The Guest network provides basic internet access for university guests. Instructions on accessing the guest Wi-Fi network can be found with [this link](#) once you arrive on campus. You will be rerouted to a webpage where you must agree to the listed terms and conditions.

Printing Services

Currently, there are no printing services available on the Fairmont State's campus for guests. The in-house printing is only available for faculty and staff. There is a UPS Store in Fairmont, and multiple printing options in Morgantown and Bridgeport/Clarksburg.

TRAVEL/TRANSIT

Arrival – IMPORTANT Safety Information

If you are traveling through West Virginia, please be aware that many roads are narrow, winding, and include steep grades. While scenic, these "country roads" can present challenges, especially for larger vehicles and those hauling trailers. Drive cautiously, reduce speed on curves, and use lower gears when navigating hills.

When approaching and traveling through Fairmont and campus, please note the following:

- **Locust Avenue Access:** Locust Avenue is a narrow roadway, particularly when accommodating two-way traffic and parked vehicles. Drivers hauling trailers should use extra caution, reduce speed, and be prepared for tight clearances when turning onto campus.
- **Downtown Traffic & Turns:** The route from Exit 136 includes urban intersections and tighter turns, especially near 3rd Street and Locust Avenue. Please plan ahead, take turns wide, and be mindful of surrounding traffic.
- **Steep Grades:** Some roads leading into and around Fairmont include steep inclines and declines. Use appropriate gearing and braking techniques, especially when hauling.
- **Pedestrian Activity:** Campus will have heavy foot traffic during the event. Please drive slowly and remain alert for students and pedestrians on crosswalks and roadways.
- **Event Signage & Volunteers:** Follow posted signage and directions from volunteers upon arrival. They will assist with unloading, parking, and trailer staging.

Parking

Parking on campus will be free for all event participants and visitors.

Passenger Vehicle Parking: The Bryant Street Parking Garage will serve as the main parking location for participants. This garage is conveniently located near campus housing and event venues and is recommended for daily use.

Large Truck and Trailer Parking: Trailers and large box trucks should be parked at the top left of campus, in the gravel lot near the tennis courts. Please enter campus at the Squibb-Wilson entrance (NOT the Bryant Street entrance) and then turn left at the University Terrace dormitory. This will then dead end at the lot where trailers should be parked. Clear signage will be posted.

Note: This is a different location than Mailer I. Mailer I instructed trailers to park at the Locust Avenue gravel lot next to the Wesley Foundation. This parking lot has been experiencing flash flooding during isolated rain showers and is not recommended for trailer parking at this time.

Welcome Dinner Parking (Feaster Center): The Feaster Center is accessible from campus, and most participants will be able to walk. That said, Fairmont State has earned the nickname “Stairmont State” for a reason. For those who may prefer to avoid the hills or need easier access, driving is absolutely an option. Parking will be available at the football field parking lot, located adjacent to the venue.

General Notes:

Please follow posted signage and directions from volunteers upon arrival.

Some areas of campus may be restricted or reserved for event operations, unloading, or trailer staging.

Allow extra time when traveling between locations, especially during peak event times.

Travel to Fairmont State University

Getting here is easy. (Though you may find that it's harder to leave!)
Follow the directions below to reach our campus.

When Driving I-79 South

- Take I-79 Exit 136 toward Downtown Fairmont / Gateway Connector.
- Follow the Fairmont Gateway Connector toward downtown Fairmont.
- Turn left onto 3rd Street.
- Continue on 3rd Street and cross the bridge over the Monongahela River.
- Turn left onto Locust Avenue.
- Continue on Locust Avenue toward Fairmont State University.
 - **Passenger Vehicles:** Turn right onto Bryant Street at the campus entrance.
 - **Truck/Trailers:** Pass Bryant Street Entrance and enter at Squibb Wilson Blvd Entrance. Follow signage to gravel lot.

When Driving I-79 from Whitehall/South Fairmont

- I-79 South to Exit 132 (South Fairmont Exit). At light, turn onto Route 250 North.
- Follow 250 North and at 2nd light turn left onto Country Club Road.
- At 1st light, turn right onto Locust Avenue.
- At 3rd light, turn left at the main entrance to campus and proceed up hill to parking.

Airports Near Fairmont, WV

Flying in? Don't worry. These airports are all a reasonable drive to our campus:

- **Pittsburgh International Airport (412-472-3525) – 1.5-hour drive**
Located in Pittsburgh, PA, open 24 hours
- **Morgantown Municipal Airport (304-291-7461) – 30-minute drive**
Located in Morgantown, WV, open from 5 am - 12 pm daily
- **North Central West Virginia Airport (304-842-3400) – 30-minute drive**
Located in Bridgeport, WV, open 24 hours
- **Arnold Palmer Regional Airport (724-539-8100) – 1.5-hour drive**
Located in Latrobe, PA, open 9 am - 4 pm on Monday - Friday and 12 pm - 4 pm on Saturday
- **Mid-Ohio Valley Regional Airport (304-464-5113) – 2-hour drive**
Located in Parkersburg, WV, open 7 am - 5:30 pm Monday - Friday, 9 am - 12 pm on Saturday, and 4:30 pm - 6 pm on Sunday

NOTE: Please note that transit systems and rideshare services such as Uber and Lyft are limited in West Virginia due to geographic constraints and will not be consistently available in the Fairmont area. Participants are encouraged to complete the shuttle information in the Personal Information Form to indicate a need for transit assistance, or to plan transportation arrangements in advance whenever possible.

Tygart Lake State Park Travel

Input Tygart Lake Marina into GPS. This should bring you into Tygart Lake State Park via Boyce Road. Trucks and trailers MUST enter this way. Simply entering Tygart Lake State Park will sometimes route drivers in via Parkview Road. This route is not appropriate for trailers or significant event traffic. Signage will be posted on the day of the event.

AGAIN, do not rely blindly on GPS, as it may route you to Parkview Road, which is not suitable for trailers or event traffic. Enter the park via Boyce Road.

Two shuttles will be available at 6:00 AM and 6:30 AM from campus, to allow all participants to arrive before the start of canoe races. If participants wish to arrive earlier to help with canoe unloading, ensure to take the early shuttle, which will leave campus as soon as it is full, but no later than 6:40 AM.

After 6:40 AM, all participants are responsible for their own transportation to Tygart Lake State Park.

COMPETITION INFORMATION

Presentation Teams will have the opportunity for AV checks in Wallman Hall Theatre (SSC and CC) or Library MMB (SURV) during registration on Wednesday, 6/24/2026. During the AV check, teams may review their presentation slides, audio, and tour the presentation venue. ***In accordance with competition RFPs, Fairmont State will provide access to electrical outlets, a projection screen, a projector, and HDMI/USB C hookups.*** Campus guest Wi-Fi is also available. Teams must bring any additional equipment they need.

Meal Locations

Meals will be provided throughout the event on Fairmont State's campus and at Tygart Lake State Park. On Thursday we will have breakfast and lunch served at the Falcon Center Cafeteria, and dinner served at our opening ceremony at the Feaster Center. On Friday we will have breakfast and lunch both served at Tygart Lake State Park. Lunch will be served at the Marina for Concrete Canoe and Sustainable Solutions, and at the Tygart Dam Welcome Center for Surveying. *Note that no dinner will be provided on Friday, so this is your opportunity to explore the food options in or around Fairmont and Grafton.* We have restaurant recommendations under the Local Recommendations section of the [CESC Website](#). On Saturday, breakfast and lunch will be on campus in the Falcon Center Cafeteria, and the awards banquet and dinner will be in the Falcon Center Gym 1.

Upon check-in, each participant will receive meal tickets. These tickets **must** be presented to receive each corresponding meal.

Meals during the event will always include vegetarian and vegan options. Most meals will be either "grab & go", or "buffet" style. Volunteers and signage will be present to help direct traffic flow, and we ask that all participants cooperate as we try to feed over 600 people at once.

Please note that meal tickets are provided only for registered participants. We will **not** be providing meal tickets for spectators/team members who travel with registered participants if they are not registered themselves. Wednesday June 24th

Registration & Check-In

Welcome to the Championships! As you arrive in Fairmont, make your way to the Falcon Center. Parking is available in the Bryant Street Parking Garage for all passenger vehicles. Official check-in time will be from 2:00 PM to 8:00 PM, held in the Falcon Center. Every participant will have to check-in individually to receive their key package and swag bag.

ALL REGISTRANTS (students and faculty advisors) must complete their waiver before arriving on campus. Teams will not be allowed to check in until all participating team members have completed their waiver.

Presentation A/V Check and Venue Tour

Wallman Hall and Library MMA will be available 2:00 PM – 6:00 PM for participants to tour the facility and to verify their laptop capabilities. This is not a requirement and is being held as a courtesy walk-in event.

Captains' Meetings

For each of the competitions, Captains' Meetings will have designated rooms to meet in as indicated in the Schedule of Events. It is essential for each team captain to attend these meetings, as information will be shared that is not included in this mailer. Please note in the schedule of events when and where each meeting is held. These meetings will cover presentations, displays, pictures, technical activities, specific scheduling information, and time for questions.

UESI Surveying Teams: Each team's physical subdivision maps must be turned in on *Wednesday, June 24th* by one member of their team at the Captain's Meeting. Map check-in will begin at 7:30 PM in Library MMA to allow teams to turn in their maps prior to the beginning of the captains' meeting at 8:00 PM. Each school is responsible for bringing their maps to Fairmont State.

Concrete Canoe Display Drop-off, Set-up, and Pick-up

Concrete Canoe Displays are on the Falcon Center Quad. Trailers will leave the Tennis Court lot in groups of 3 from 6:30 AM to 8:00 AM and unload canoes and displays on Campus Drive E. Each team will have 10 minutes to unload trailers. Display drop-off route can be found below. Each team will be directed to their display area, which will be marked with a sign. Maps of display day setup on the Falcon Center Quad will be provided the night before at the Captains' Meeting.

Please note that drivers will be required to BACK down Campus Drive E in-line with other trailers. Fairmont State University Campus Police will be guiding traffic and several spotters will be provided to guide trailers for safety. If your driver is not comfortable backing a trailer this far, Fairmont State will have volunteers on site to assist.



All display materials should fit within a 12' x 25' area. Please be aware that everything in West Virginia has somewhat uneven ground. Our team has done our best to place each team in a flat area. It is recommended to pack some shims and/or foam to help level things out.

Canoe and display pick-up will begin at 4:00 PM in the reverse order of display drop-off, following the same routes. Teams will have 10 minutes to load their trailers. We recommend that teams coordinate with drivers to ensure that their display is packed and ready to load before their trailer arrives.

Concrete Canoe Weighing, Swamp, and Measuring

Weigh-in and team pictures will start at 7:30 AM and will be in the same order as the display drop-off schedule. A volunteer will notify each school when they are needed to stage at the weigh station.

After your canoe and cylinder weights have been recorded, teams will take their canoes to the swamp tank, which will be on the Falcon Center Quad. Team photos will be taken at each canoe and display setup. Judging will start at 11:00 AM with a lunch break at 12:00 PM and will resume after the 1:00 PM Captains' Meeting.

We ask that teams that are judged early keep displays up until 3:30 PM so other teams and the public can view displays.

Sustainable Solutions Presentations, and Debrief

Sustainable Solutions presentations will take place on *Thursday, June 25th*, from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM in the Wallman Hall Theatre. Teams should arrive 15 minutes before their designated presentation time.

One clicker and two wireless microphones per team will be provided. Please refer to the Sustainable Solutions Presentation on the [CESC Website](#) for specific times for each school. These presentations will be open for all attendees and spectators to watch. Once a team begins their presentation, people will not be allowed to enter the room until the Q&A is over.

After presentations, there will be a debrief by judges from 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM where judges will present, provide general feedback, and answer questions on this year's prompt. Teams may submit appeals to any deductions on their submittal as outlined in the Sustainable Solutions ruleset provided by ASCE. These will be addressed on Saturday in the Falcon Center Conference Rooms on the 3rd floor.

All presentation times are final, and it is the responsibility of each team to coordinate their members and arrivals.

UESI Surveying Presentations

Surveying presentations will take place on *Thursday, June 25th* in the Ruth Ann Musick Library in room MMA starting at 8:00 AM. Teams should arrive 15 minutes before their designated presentation time.

One clicker and two wireless microphones per team will be provided. Please refer to the Surveying Presentation Schedule on the [CESC Website](#). Surveying presentations are only open to each team's chapter, advisors, guests, or family.

All presentation times are final, and it is the responsibility of each team to coordinate their members and arrivals.

UESI Surveying Equipment Practice

UESI Surveying Equipment Practice will occur on the Engineering Technology Building / Hunt Haugh Hall Quad in session beginning at 8:30 AM, taking place concurrently with presentations. Teams are assigned time slots to ensure there are no conflicting times with presentations. Practice times can be found on the [CESC Website](#). We encourage all teams to take advantage of this opportunity to become familiar with the provided equipment that they will use for field tasks. ASCE Judges will be able to answer any questions during the practice.

Friday June 26th

Concrete Canoe Drop-off & Races

The Concrete Canoe Races will be located at Tygart Lake State Park, which is approximately 50 minutes from campus. Teams are expected to start leaving campus at 6:00 AM. Trailer parking is available on-site at Launch 4, which can be found on the Tygart Lake State Park Map. Volunteers will be on-site to assist with parking logistics.

Each team will be assigned a 10' x 18' area to set up tents along the spectator area. This is the equivalent of two parking spaces where passenger vehicles can be backed up to the spaces.

Race schedules can be found on the [CESC Website](#). Teams are responsible for knowing the order of the races and being responsive to calls from the Judges.

Slalom races will begin after the captain and paddler meeting at 8:00 AM. Times for all races will be recorded and displayed on a board near the Judges' tent. After slaloms and sprints are complete, petite and grand sprint finals will occur.

Please note that all paddlers are required to wear a US Coast Guard-approved inherently buoyant (no inflatables) Type I, II, or III Personal Flotation Device (life jacket) while in a canoe during competition per ASCE regulations.

UESI Surveying Field Tasks

Field Tasks will take place at the Tygart Dam Welcome Center and Dam Overlook. Prior to the Field Tasks portion of the competition, a Captains' Meeting will be held at one of the check-in tents near the picnic shelter at 7:30 AM. **All** team members are required to wear close-toe shoes and either a safety vest or high-visibility shirt (construction or high-visibility yellow, orange, pink, blue, red, or green) while completing the Field Tasks portion of the competition. The layout of the Field Tasks will be discussed at a Captains' Meeting prior. Please refer to the UESI Surveying Field Task Schedule on the [CESC Website](#).

Concrete Canoe Presentations

Concrete Canoe presentations will be held in the Wallman Hall Theatre 7:30 AM -5:00 PM.

Unfortunately, food and drinks other than water are not allowed in the Wallman Hall Theatre so please plan accordingly to eat breakfast before or after your team's presentation.

Presentation order can be found on the [CESC Website](#). Teams should arrive at least 15 minutes before their presentation time. **Two wireless microphones and one clicker are available for use during presentations.**

These presentations will be open to the public and supporters are encouraged to attend as well. Once a team begins their presentation, people will not be allowed to enter the room until the Q&A is over.

All presentation times are final, and it is the responsibility of each team to coordinate their members and arrivals.

Sustainable Solutions Poster Display

Teams may begin setting up their easels and posters at 1:00 PM in Colebank Hall. Open displays will take place from 1:30 PM to 4:00 PM within Colebank Hall. Please note that teams are responsible for transporting their posters to Fairmont and for transportation back home. Teams are also responsible for providing their own easel for display, unless you specifically requested one from Fairmont's planning team. Teams should stay with their posters to discuss their project with other attendees during the session. Fan Favorite Voting will take place during this time as well.

UESI Surveying Subdivision Displays

Each team's physical subdivision maps must be turned in on *Wednesday, June 24th* by one member of their team at the Captain's Meeting. Map check-in will begin at 7:30 PM in Library MMA to allow teams to turn in their maps prior to the beginning of the captains meeting at 8:00 PM. Each school is responsible for bringing their maps to Fairmont State.

Each school will be assigned a display table in Colebank Hall. Teams may begin setting up their tables at 1:00 PM in Colebank Hall. Open displays will take place from 1:30 PM to 4:00 PM within Colebank Hall. The maps each team turned in will be set out for display. Fairmont State will provide corner weights for each map set. We encourage each team to bring their own university tablecloth and to use this opportunity to meet other schools.



Awards Banquet

The Awards Banquet will be held from 7:00 PM to 10:00 PM at the Falcon Center. The Awards Banquet has a recommended dress code of business formal.

Participant seating will be unassigned on a “first come, first served” basis. Teams will not have reserved seating and are not guaranteed seats together. Participants are not allowed to sit at the tables reserved for VIP guests, judges, ASCE staff, etc. Official Championships events conclude at the end of the Awards Banquet.

The Awards Banquet is a time for all teams to be recognized for their hard work and celebrate their achievements. We ask that this celebration is kept respectful and that all attendees keep in mind the event policies presented in Mailer II. Anyone who is in violation of these policies are subject to removal from the Awards Banquet at the discretion of ASCE and the Championships hosts.

Please note that due to capacity limitations, only registered students, registered faculty advisors, and those who purchased an Awards Banquet ticket will be granted admission to the Awards Banquet.

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
