Safety-First Culture Information

ASCE and Michigan Technological University are encouraging a Safety-First Culture during the student symposium. We encourage all symposium participants to embrace this concept by thinking about safety in their activities coming to, returning from, and while at our symposium. We want **every** symposium participant to return home safe and healthy.

To generate a Safety-First Culture, we have designated Henrique (Kiko) de Melo e Silva and Rob Fritz as our symposium safety officers. Further, be on the lookout for safety information at the symposium, such as the location of first-aid supplies, who in the crowd have first-aid training, and Safety Moments.

What is a Safety Moment? A Safety Moment consists of a quick discussion on an activity-specific, site-specific, or general safety topic. The Safety Moment may be presented by the leader of an activity, the symposium safety officer, or a member of the host symposium planning team. We ask that all participants give their undivided attention to the Safety Moment discussion and embrace the safety-first concept.

If an injury does occur during the symposium, it should be reported to the competition head judge, symposium safety officer, or activity leader immediately so that appropriate action can be taken based on the injury. If it is a true emergency, please call 911 first.

As a best practice, we strongly recommend that faculty advisors keep and maintain on-hand a list of emergency contact information for their university and participating students. ASCE and the student symposium host do not collect emergency contact information from registrants.

In the spirit of a Safety Moment, here are some safe driving habits to keep in mind as you travel to the student symposium:

- Driving at the speed limit has proven to save lives.
- Do not drive when tired. Swap drivers often.
- Minimum of two people awake at all times when wheels are rolling.
- Be aware of how larger/heavier vehicles behave when stopping or turning.
- Be aware of your surroundings when backing any vehicle, especially trailers. Better yet, avoid backing up at all, if possible.
- Use a spotter to watch when you must back up a vehicle.
- Slow down when the conditions warrant (rain, snow, darkness, pedestrians nearby).
- Perform a circle of safety around your vehicle to identify what is in your blind spots.





Competition Safety Information

Please see the competition rules for full details. If there is a discrepancy between the rules and the information listed below, the competition rules are to be followed.

ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition: Safety gear (closed-toe water shoes and Personal Floatation Device (life jacket)) for each paddler is the responsibility of each team. (<u>Exhibit 9: Race Regulations & Safety</u>)

AISC ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition: Personal protective equipment is the responsibility of each team. During all construction activities, builders must wear hard hats and protective eyewear or safety goggles (<u>Section 10.1.6</u>). During all loading activities, competitors must wear hard hats, protective eyewear or safety goggles, work gloves, and steel toe or composite work boots that extend above the ankle (<u>Section 11.2.1.3</u>). The hardhats must meet ANSI standard Z89.1, and the protective eyewear or safety goggles must meet ANSI standard Z87.1

Surveying Competition: Team members are responsible for providing their own required safety equipment including closed-toe shoes and safety-colored shirts or vests to participate in the field tasks. (Section 6: Safety)

Timber-Strong Design Build Competition: <u>Section 5.4.3 Safety Gear</u> – Each team is responsible for bringing their own tools, safety gear, and personal protective equipment (PPE) including but not limited to construction hard hats, safety glasses, gloves (tips of gloves may not be cut off), closed-toed shoes, long pants, and safety vests or high-visibility shirts. Long hair needs to be tied back at the construction site. Please see <u>Section 5.4.3 Safety Gear</u> for information on power tools.

Wastewater Treatment Competition: Operators are required to wear personal protective equipment including hard hats, safety gloves, safety glasses, closed-toed shoes, and long pants at all times during the construction and treatment phases. Any person handling chemicals must wear a long-sleeved shirt or any other article of clothing to cover arms and hands, and must be protected using chemical hazard protection gloves (i.e. latex or nitrile). Please see the Safety Subsection for more information.





Business Meeting (Eligibility Requirement)

The Business Meeting is scheduled to take place on Saturday, April 12, 2025 at 4:30 pm.

The business meeting agenda will be sent out at a later time. If you have additional agenda items and/or motions that your student chapter would like to be included in the agenda, please submit them to asce@mtu.edu by April 4th.

Note that the business meeting is the official business meeting for the Student Conference Board of Delegates. The Board of Delegates consists of two student delegates (preferably a senior or junior in an ASCE leadership position and a sophomore in or aspiring to an ASCE leadership position) and the faculty advisor from each student chapter. Each student delegate must be a member in good standing with their student chapter and the Society. Each student chapter in the Student Conference has one vote.

At least one member of your ASCE student chapter must participate in the Business Meeting as part of the eligibility requirements to advance to finals for Concrete Canoe, Steel Bridge, Sustainable Solutions, and Surveying.



Parking Meters Across Campus: Parking is mostly through ParkingMobile if you would like to park a vehicle closer but metered parking locations fill very quickly.









Photo from Interactive Map showing road network to different points on campus for reference:

Competition Presentation & Display Information

All Competitions: Each student team that presents is required to bring their digital presentation on a USB. The host will provide laptop and projector equipment. Wifi access will also be provided through the MTU guest network.

Please see the competition rules for full details. If there is a discrepancy between the rules and the information listed below, the competition rules are to be followed.

ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition: Teams are responsible for providing all necessary materials for the display portion of the competition. (<u>Section 7: Prototype Display Requirements</u>). Teams should bring presentations on a thumb drive for the technical presentation (<u>Section 8: Technical Presentation</u>).

AISC ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition: Teams are responsible for providing all necessary materials for the aesthetic display portion of the competition. (<u>Section 6.2.1</u>)

Surveying Competition:

Topographic Map Display: It is the responsibility of each team to bring one (1) 24-inch by 36-inch paper copy set of the topographic mapping project to the symposium, which will be <u>used for public display at the student symposium (Section 7.3. Paper Copy Submittals)</u>. The paper copy set shall be submitted to the student symposium host at check-in. (*This copy is for the public display and does not replace the required online submission due on February 24, 2025, by 5:00 pm EST.*)

- Teams are encouraged to bring a standard 6ft tablecloth displaying your school's name, logo, or chapter name (not required).
- Teams should plan to stay with their topographic map public display to discuss their project with spectators.

Field Task Equipment: Please refer to <u>Appendix D</u>, <u>Equipment List</u>, <u>in the rules</u> for a full list of required items for the competition. All items must be supplied by each team at the symposium competition.

Sustainable Solutions:

For teams competing in the Sustainable Solutions Competition: we will **NOT** provide the easel for the poster presentation.

- Teams will be expected to stay with their poster during the display to discuss their project with spectators.
- Please try if possible to have a stand that can hold the bottom of the poster about 36 inches off of the ground to allow a good viewing angle.

ASCE Construction Institute Competition: All teams should come prepared with a laptop. Laptops or computers will not be provided at the competition. One per team is sufficient, but it is recommended that each participating student brings a laptop.

Timber-Strong Design Build Competition: Teams will be responsible for providing their own easel for the visual aid at the build site, as outlined in <u>Section 9.2 of the rules</u>. You can find standard 63" poster board easels online. Easel <u>Example.</u>



Room Location Descriptions: (There will also be signs to help direct you) **Mub Ballroom**– 2nd floor, first ballroom from the stairs

Mub Ballroom B– 2nd floor, continue west from the stairs and the Mub Ballroom

GLRC Conference Room– Enter from the South, and continue down the hall to the right. The stairs to the second floor are past the double doors. Then once up a floor the room will be off to your left

Superior Room— Basement floor, by the stairs. The stairs to the basement are on the north side of the building.

Forestry Building 144— When coming from the parking lot on the South side of the building which is the closest to Lot 24, Enter through the double doors and go straight past the atrium on the second story pasting through a second set of double doors into an all wood corridor then turn left and it will be the last/only room on your left once you pass an additional set of stairs. When entering from the north entrance (lower campus area), take the first left up the stairs and go off to the right slightly then straight down the hall that is parallel to the staircase you took and go into the last/only classroom on your left.

Forestry Building G002– When entering from the South go down the 'bowl' staircase and the entrances are on





the opposing wall, and down the hallway that is to the left. When entering from the north the entrance is down the hall to the left.

Fisher 139– In between the North and South entrances of Fisher hall, to the west. Not to be confused with Rekhi hall, which is attached to Fisher but starts at the diagonal stairs leading to the round conference room.



Student Symposium Paper Competition

The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career. The competition consists of a paper submission and a presentation at the student symposium.

Submission deadline is: March 1st Submission email/link is: asce@mtu.edu

This topic is the same topic as the <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u>. However, the Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students are two separate competitions and <u>must be submitted separately</u>. The Student Symposium Paper Competition paper was due March 1st and submitted to <u>asce@mtu.edu</u>. The <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u> was also due March 1st and submitted to <u>student@asce.org</u>.

*****SOCIETY-WIDE FINALS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT****

Both the paper submission and the presentation are mandatory for any ASCE Student Chapter participating in the 2025 ASCE <dropdown> Student Symposium that wishes to be <u>eligible to advance to ASCE Society-wide</u> competition finals and SSBC National Finals. Competitions **requiring** participation include:

- ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition
- ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition
- ASCE UESI Surveying Competition, and
- AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition.

Note: Any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.





ASCE Society Competition Eligibility Requirements

Competitions that advance to an ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals include the ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, and ASCE UESI Surveying Competition. The AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility requirements below. See SSBC Rules for more information.

The purpose of student competitions is to provide student members career-enrichment opportunities to gain hands-on, practical experience and leadership skills. Society Competitions are an important and special opportunity to showcase the engineering and professional skills of student teams. As such, mutual respect is required for all stakeholders, including competitors, judges, hosts, and guests. Invitations to the Student Symposia and the ASCE Student Civil Engineering Championships/Society-wide Competition Finals are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in sanctions, disqualifications, and loss of invitations. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide competition finals are more stringent than the requirements for participation at the student symposia competitions.

ELIGIBILITY FOR STUDENT SYMPOSIUM COMPETITION

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters to compete at the Student Symposia Competitions:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

- 1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than the start of their Student Symposium.
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report or EZ Annual Reporting Form **no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST**.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ASCE SOCIETY-WIDE COMPETITION FINALS

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters in order to advance to the ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

- 1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's <u>full Annual Report</u>, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST, <u>and have received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100.</u> Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify to advance to competition finals; and
- 2. Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:
 - a. On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.
 - b. Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.



Maps, Weather Reminder, and Travel Resources

Please exercise caution and read the following before driving to the ASCE Eastern Great Lakes Regional Student Symposium in Houghton, MI:

- Please watch this video(https://youtu.be/bp1f4iLo058) which is also linked under the Resources for Teams and Chapters on the Eastern Great Lakes Symposium Website.
- Once passing through Marquette, there are not many opportunities to stop for things you may need (i.e. gas, presentation supplies, personal needs). If there is anything you need/forget, make sure to check before passing through Marquette.
- Northern Michigan weather in early April is very unpredictable and forecasts are only accurate about 24-48 hours in advance:
 - Heavy snow and dangerous winds are not uncommon at this time of year.
 - Give yourself the option to leave for the symposium a day early. If a winter storm is predicted, exercise that option and beat the storm.
 - Visibility can drop to zero during storms.
- Northern Michigan is very rural:
 - Gas stations may not be open 24 hours, or after 7 PM in the winter:
 - Traveling through Michigan? Plan to get gas in Gaylord, St. Ignace, Munising, or Marquette if you need gas at night.
 - Please look at the map of gas stations (Figure 2) in the Upper Peninsula that are farther than 30 minutes from campus to plan where you will be stopping to prevent any issues from arising.
 - Most UP rest areas are seasonal roadside parks and are not open until late April to early May:
 - Year-round rest areas along the primary route are:
 - I-75: Mackinaw City
 - I-75 North only: St. Ignace
 - US-2: 3mi East of Naubinway.
 - M-28: 4mi West of Seney.
 - US-41: between Harvey and Marquette (MI Welcome Center).
 - Cell phone service is less robust than in more populated parts of the country. Major carriers cover most of the UP, including Houghton. Other carriers may experience issues.
 - Check your carrier service map before you go.
 - Consider the possibility that their coverage may need to be more complete in their online maps.
 - M-77 between Blaney Park and Seney has limited to no coverage for most carriers
 - Consider downloading an offline version of your route map(Google or Apple Maps)
- Most of the UP is not served by freeways:
 - o Observe slower speed limits. Slow down for towns.
 - o Pass safely. Wait for passing lanes.
 - o MDOT has fully embraced traffic circles in Munising and Marquette. When entering, please yield.
 - Houghton has a slope-modified traffic circle, between the west end of downtown and the Portage Lake Lift Bridge, known as the "Yooper Loop". We will be creating an instructional photo of how to navigate to prevent accidents.





- Watch the Mackinac bridge conditions to make sure you can take the bridge, as it closes in very windy conditions. Consider taking the alternate route through Wisconsin if necessary.
 - Text "MacBridge" to 67283 to receive updates about the bridge conditions and closures
 - Click the <u>link</u> to see the current bridge and weather conditions




Fig. 1: Campus Map to see the layout of campus.
