Safety-First Culture Information

ASCE and Mississippi State University are encouraging a Safety-First Culture during the student symposium. We encourage all symposium participants to embrace this concept by thinking about safety in their activities coming to, returning from, and while at our symposium. We want **every** symposium participant to return home safe and healthy.

To generate a Safety-First Culture, we have designated Jacob Payne (Lead), Matt Stevenson, Michael Bratcher, and Jay Jackson as our symposium safety officers. Further, be on the lookout for safety information at the symposium, such as the location of first-aid supplies, who in the crowd has first-aid training and Safety Moments.

What is a Safety Moment? A Safety Moment consists of a quick discussion on an activity-specific, site-specific, or general safety topic. The Safety Moment may be presented by the leader of an activity, the symposium safety officer, or a member of the host symposium planning team. We ask that all participants give their undivided attention to the Safety Moment discussion and embrace the safety-first concept.

If an injury does occur during the symposium, it should be reported to the competition head judge, symposium safety officer, or activity leader immediately so that appropriate action can be taken based on the injury. If it is a true emergency, please call 911 first.

In the spirit of a Safety Moment, here are some safe driving habits to keep in mind as you travel to the student symposium:

- Driving at the speed limit has proven to save lives.
- Do not drive when tired. Swap drivers often.
- Minimum of two people awake at all times when wheels are rolling.
- Be aware of how larger/heavier vehicles behave when stopping or turning.
- Be aware of your surroundings when backing any vehicle, especially trailers. Better yet, avoid backing up at all, if possible.
- Use a spotter to watch when you must back up a vehicle.
- Slow down when the conditions warrant (rain, snow, darkness, pedestrians nearby).
- Perform a circle of safety around your vehicle to identify what is in your blind spots.

Water Bottles

Please bring your own water bottles. There will be water bottle dispensers during the daytime activities on Thursday and Saturday. We plan to have additional water bottles available; however, we will only have so many to provide for the entire 3-day symposium.

Competition Safety Information

Please see the competition rules for full details. If there is a discrepancy between the rules and the information listed below, the competition rules are to be followed.

ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition: Safety gear (closed-toe water shoes and Personal Floatation Device (life jacket)) for each paddler is the responsibility of each team. ([Exhibit 9: Race Regulations & Safety](#))

AISC ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition: Personal protective equipment is the responsibility of each team. During all construction activities, builders must wear hard hats and protective eyewear or safety goggles ([Section 10.1.6](#)). During all loading activities, competitors must wear hard hats, protective eyewear or safety goggles, work gloves, and steel toe or composite work boots that extend above the ankle ([Section 11.2.1.3](#)). The hardhats must meet ANSI standard Z89.1, and the protective eyewear or safety goggles must meet ANSI standard Z87.1

Surveying Competition: Team members are responsible for providing their own required safety equipment including closed-toe shoes and safety-colored shirts or vests to participate in the field tasks. ([Section 6: Safety](#))

Timber-Strong Design Build Competition: [Section 5.4.3 Safety Gear](#) – Each team is responsible for bringing their own tools, safety gear, and personal protective equipment (PPE) including but not limited to construction hard hats, safety glasses, gloves (tips of gloves may not be cut off), closed-toed shoes, long pants, and safety vests or high-visibility shirts. Long hair needs to be tied back at the construction site. Please see [Section 5.4.3 Safety Gear](#) for information on power tools.

Business Meeting (*Eligibility Requirement*)

The Business Meeting is scheduled to take place on Friday, March 7, 2025 at 6:00 pm.

The business meeting agenda is shown on the last three pages of this document. Thank you to those that replied with comments on the draft agenda sent out February 13, 2025.

Note that the business meeting is officially the business meeting for the Student Conference Board of Delegates. The Board of Delegates consists of two student delegates (preferably a senior or junior in an ASCE leadership position and a sophomore in or aspiring to an ASCE leadership position) and the faculty advisor from each student chapter. Each student delegate must be a member in good standing with their student chapter and the Society. Each student chapter in the Student Conference has one vote.

At least one member of your ASCE student chapter must participate in the Business Meeting as part of the eligibility requirements to advance to finals for Concrete Canoe, Steel Bridge, Sustainable Solutions, and Surveying.

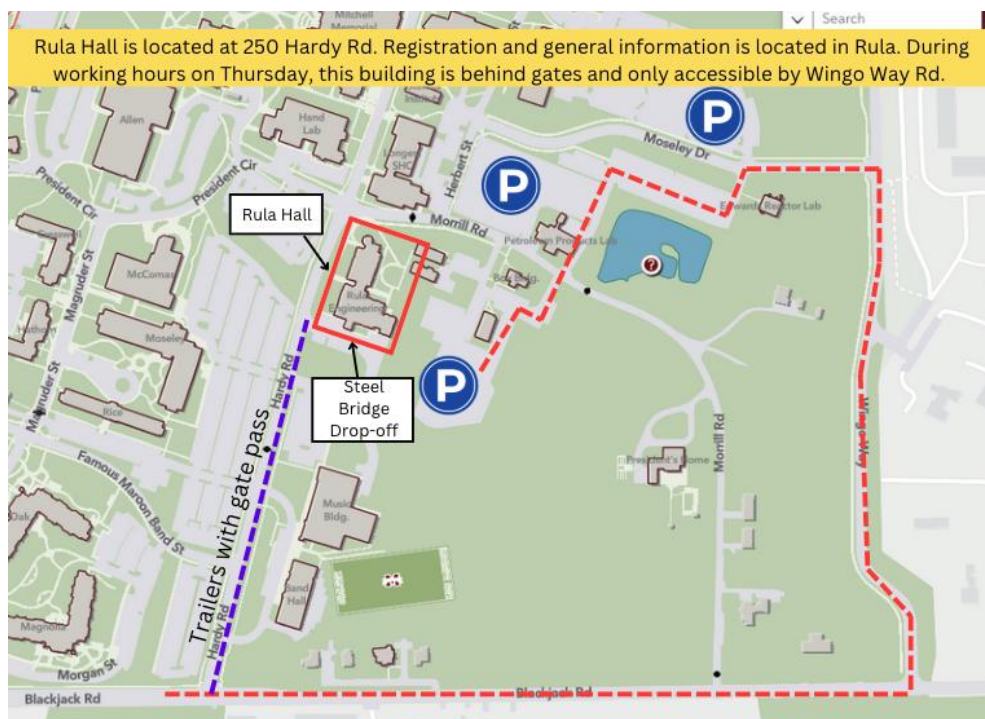

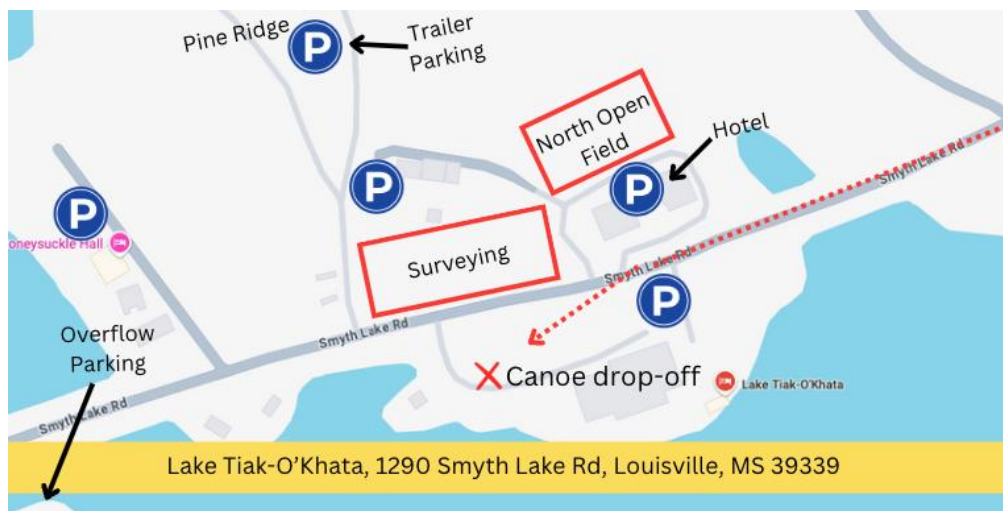
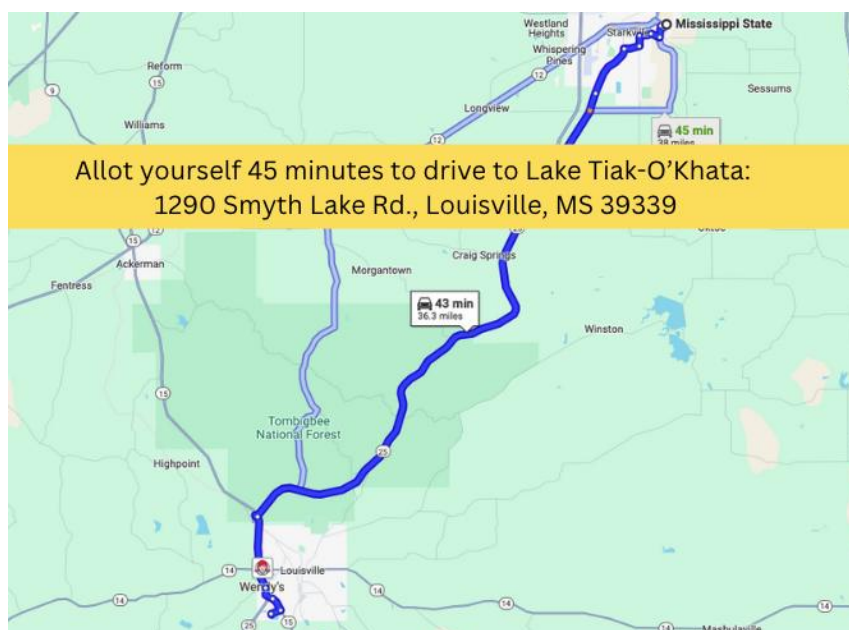
Maps, Directions, and Parking Information (cont.)

Friday, March 7th we will be at Lake Tiak-O'Khata in Louisville, MS. **Please carpool as there will be limited parking spaces.** Overflow parking is ½ mile down the road going west on Smyth Lake Road and on the left side of the road. We will have signs and students directing you where to drop off canoes and park. On Friday night, the networking event will be held in the Gridiron Club at Davis Wade Stadium on the Main Campus at Mississippi State University. Parking is in the Barnes and Noble parking lot, west of the stadium. The address shown on the next page will bring you to the entrance where you will enter Gate G1. The Gridiron Club will be down the hall to the left. The business meeting will be held in another location in the stadium, but everyone will enter Gate G1.

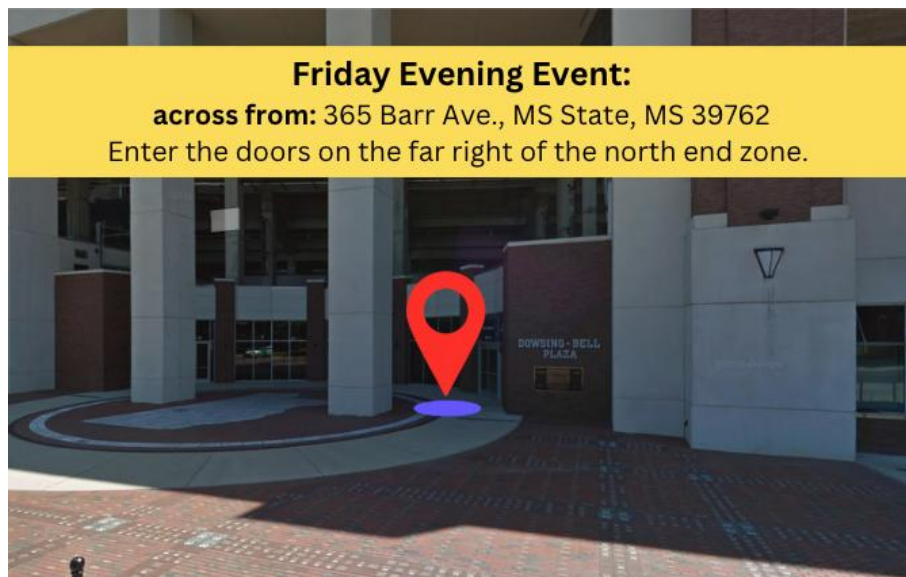

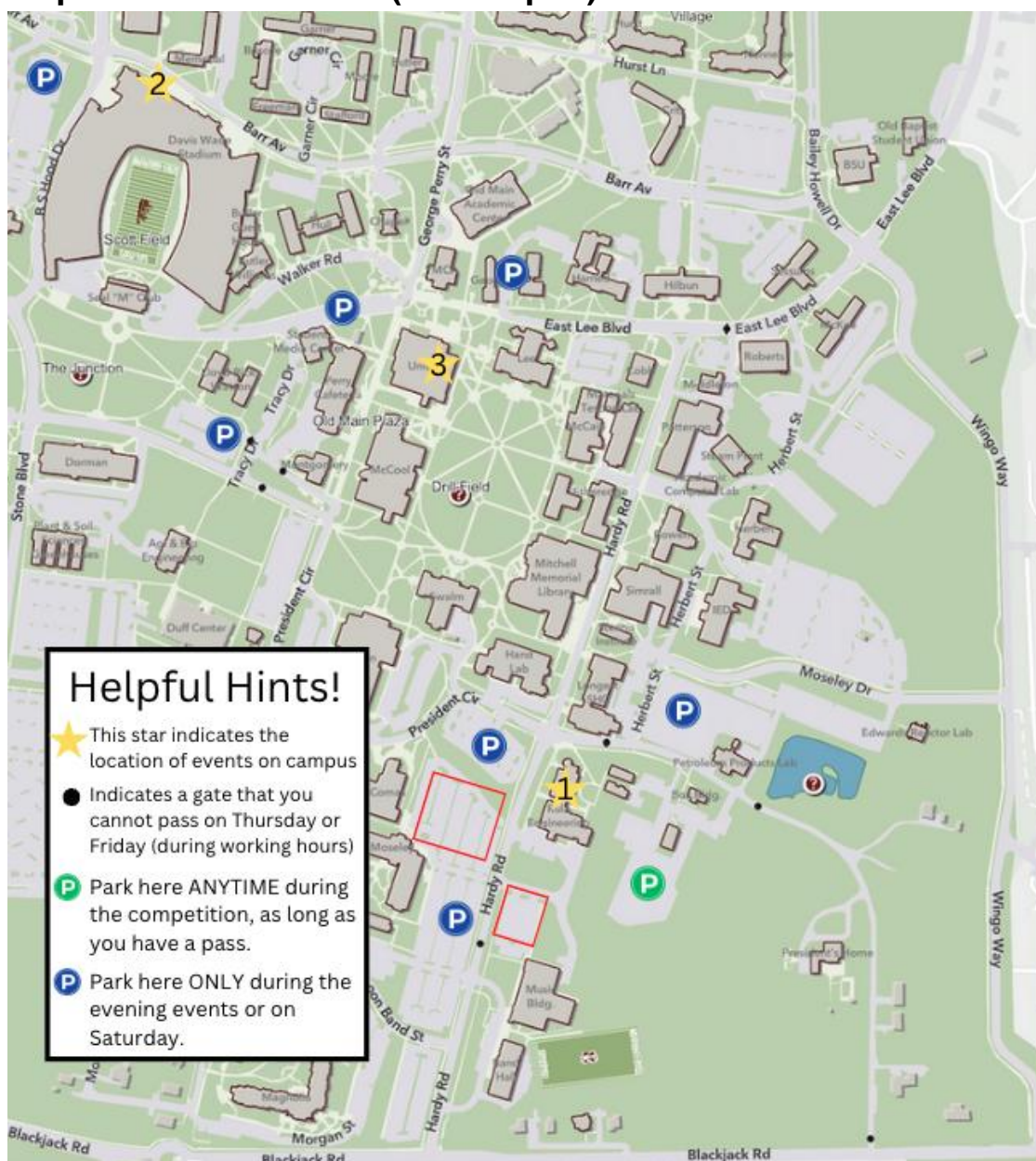
With the conclusion of the awards ceremony on Saturday night will conclude the 2025 ASCE Symposium.

Surveying Competition:

Topographic Map Display: It is the responsibility of each team to bring two (1) 24-inch by 36-inch paper copy sets of the topographic mapping project to the symposium. One will be used for public display at the student symposium ([Section 7.3, Paper Copy Submittals](#)).

(This copy is for the public display and does not replace the required online submission due on February 24, 2025, by 5:00 pm EST.)

The other copy set will be used when you make your oral presentations. Both paper copy sets shall be submitted to the student symposium host at check-in.

- Teams are encouraged to bring a standard 6-ft tablecloth displaying your school's name, logo, or chapter name (*not required*).
- Teams should plan to stay with their topo map public display until 10:00 am on Saturday (3/8) to discuss their project with spectators.

Field Task Equipment: Please refer to [Appendix D, Equipment List, in the rules](#) for a full list of required items for the competition. All items must be supplied by each individual team at the symposium competition.

Sustainable Solutions:

Poster Session: For teams competing in the Sustainable Solutions Competition: we will provide the easel for the poster presentation. The poster must be mounted (i.e., rigid backing).

- Teams will be expected to stay with their poster during the display to discuss their project with spectators.

SPECIAL NOTES ON SPECIFIC LOCAL & REQUIRED COMPETITIONS AT THE 2025 ASCE GULF COAST STUDENT SYMPOSIUM

- *Paper & Presentation Competition:* Participating in this competition is required if any of your Society Competition Teams intend to participate in the ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals. We will have a computer, projector, and screen available for your presentation. Please bring a flash drive that has your presentation saved on it (just in case). We also plan (but cannot guarantee) to have a pointer clicker for you during your presentation.
- *Stormwater Competition:* There will be two starting time slots available at 10 am and 1 pm. You do not need to schedule a time slot beforehand. Please have one of your team members bring a laptop that can run graphics well.
- *Buried Structure Competition:* There will be three available starting time slots (8 am, 10 am, and 1 pm). Please message asce25symposium@lists.msstate.edu your preferred time slot by next week or we will schedule your team for any one of these three time slots. If your team plans to participate in this competition and does not have a compaction device, then please provide us advanced notice so we can accommodate your team.
- *Concrete Cornhole Competition:* To create a slippery concrete cornhole surface, teams may use epoxy, seal coat wax, or other similar materials. This is only to be applied after the concrete is cured. Teams must state their Notice of Intent to participate in this competition at the Registration Desk on Thursday (3/6).
- *Transportation FE Speed Exam Competition:* This competition is scheduled for Friday (3/7) in the morning before the canoe races begin. The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career. The competition consists of a paper submission and a presentation at the student symposium.

The topic for the 2025 ASCE Gulf Coast Student Symposium Paper Competition is: The Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students topic. Please visit the [Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students website](#) to review the topic.

Submission is required and was due on February 14th. Late submissions can be accepted but deductions will be at the discretion of the head judge.

This topic is the same topic as the [Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students](#). However, the Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Daniel W. The [Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students](#) is due March 1st and submitted to student@asce.org.

*****SOCIETY-WIDE FINALS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT*****

Both the paper submission and the presentation are mandatory for any ASCE Student Chapter participating in the 2025 ASCE Gulf Coast Student Symposium that wishes to be eligible to advance to ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals. Competitions **requiring** participation include:

- ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition
- ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition
- ASCE UESI Surveying Competition, and
- AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition.

OVERALL PLACING AT THE 2025 ASCE GULF COAST STUDENT SYMPOSIUM

Both the paper submission and the presentation are mandatory. Failure to meet these deliverables automatically disqualifies any ASCE Student Chapter to be awarded an overall placement at the 2025 ASCE Gulf Coast Student Symposium.

Note: Any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

Overall Symposium Winner Methodology

The top three teams with the most points will be named during the Awards Ceremony. Points are generated by participating and/or placing in competitions. Placing 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in any one competition results in 4, 3, or 2 points for your team, respectively. Participating in a competition but not placing results in 1 point for your team. Competition types are also weighed, where the Society Competitions (x4) are weighed the most and the Spirit Competitions (x1) are weighed the least as shown in the table below.

Points produced from each competition are multiplied by the weight of each competition. These multiplied values are then summed to calculate the overall points for each team. As an example, Team Gulf Coast University placed 1st in Surveying, 3rd in Construction Institute, did not place in Paper & Presentation, and placed 3rd in Starkvegas Foosball. This would result in 27 (= 4 x 4 + 2 x 3 + 1 x 3 + 2 x 1) overall points for Team Gulf Coast University.

Additional competitions may be incorporated into the symposium and be part of the scoring methodology. If more competitions are organized for this symposium, then a notice will be sent via email to addresses where Mailer 3 has been sent, at least one announcement will be made in the GroupMe, and the competitions page on the symposium website will include more information of the added competition, if any.

ASCE Society Competition Eligibility Requirements

Competitions that advance to an ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals include the ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, and ASCE UESI Surveying Competition. The AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility requirements below. See [SSBC Rules](#) for more information.

The purpose of student competitions is to provide student members career-enrichment opportunities to gain hands-on, practical experience and leadership skills. Society Competitions are an important and special opportunity to showcase the engineering and professional skills of student teams. As such, mutual respect is required for all stakeholders, including competitors, judges, hosts, and guests. Invitations to the Student Symposia and the ASCE Student Civil Engineering Championships/Society-wide Competition Finals are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in sanctions, disqualifications, and loss of invitations. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide competition finals are more stringent than the requirements for participation at the student symposia competitions.

ELIGIBILITY FOR STUDENT SYMPOSIUM COMPETITION

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters to compete at the Student Symposia Competitions:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, **no later than the start of their Student Symposium.**
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report or EZ Annual Reporting Form **no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.**

ELIGIBILITY FOR ASCE SOCIETY-WIDE COMPETITION FINALS

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters in order to advance to the ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's **full Annual Report, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST, and have received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100. Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify** to advance to competition finals; and
2. Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:
 - a. On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.
 - b. Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.
