COMPETITION & PRESENTATION SCHEDULE

To maximize student participation in the symposium, teams will be given as much flexibility as possible when building their schedules. Teams will have the opportunity to self-select time slots for society, pilot, and local competitions. By allowing more flexible scheduling, we aim to increase participation across the wide range of events offered throughout the weekend.

A read-only spreadsheet is provided below as a preview of the available competition time slots so teams may plan accordingly. Official registration for time slots will take place through Calendly links, which will be emailed to the same distribution list that received Mailer 2 on Monday, February 2nd at 8:00 AM CST. If your members of your team are not currently on this email list and would like to be added, please reach out to gcvauhan1@crimson.ua.edu.

Time slot registration will close on Friday, February 13th at 5:00 PM CST. Any teams that do not sign up for a time slot by the deadline will be randomly assigned to the remaining available slots. To ensure fairness, the preview spreadsheet does not allow editing access. Time slots must be claimed through the Calendly links once registration opens.

Our planning team will do our best to coordinate and minimize scheduling conflicts; however, we reserve the right to make adjustments as necessary to ensure the smooth execution of the symposium. A final competition schedule will be released with Mailer 3.

SYMPPOSIUM

COMMUNICATION

Clear and timely communication is essential to the success and safety of the ASCE Gulf Coast Student Symposium. With hundreds of students, faculty, judges, and volunteers participating across multiple venues and competitions, it is critical that all attendees share an understanding of how information will be distributed before and during the event.

To support this, the symposium will utilize GroupMe as its primary communication platform:

- Main Announcements GroupMe
 - All registered participants are expected to join the main announcements GroupMe. This group will be used for official symposium-wide updates, including schedule changes, weather or safety notices, venue updates, and other critical information. This channel is especially important in the event of emergencies or time-sensitive announcements.
- Competition-Specific GroupMe Chats
 - Each competition will have its own dedicated GroupMe. These groups will serve as a forum for:
 - Competition-specific updates and reminders
 - Clarifications on rules, logistics, or schedule adjustments
 - Direct communication between teams, symposium leadership, and judges
- Participants are strongly encouraged to join the GroupMe(s) for the competition(s) they are registered for to ensure they receive all relevant information.

In addition to GroupMe, participants should follow the symposium's Instagram account, @ASCEGulfCoast2026, where reminders, highlights, and select updates will also be shared throughout the weekend.

More detailed information regarding the symposium communication plan, including GroupMe links, expectations for use, and emergency communication procedures, will be released with Mailer 3 and included in the Symposium Safety Packet. All participants are expected to review this information prior to arrival.

Inappropriate language, as well as bullying, or harassment of any kind, will not be tolerated. Any individual who violates this policy will be removed immediately from the GroupMe, and the team's faculty advisor will be notified, as well as ASCE Nationals.

BUSINESS MEETING

Eligibility Requirement

The Business Meeting is scheduled to take place on Friday, March 13th, 2026 at 6pm. A draft business meeting agenda that will be distributed with Mailer 3, and chapters will have 1 week to submit any additional items to the agenda. A finalized schedule will be released one week before the symposium begins.

The business meeting is the annual meeting for the Student Conference Board of Delegates. The Board of Delegates consists of two student delegates (preferably a senior or junior in an ASCE leadership position and a sophomore in or aspiring to an ASCE leadership position) and the faculty advisor from each student chapter.

The draft agenda will include such items as any unresolved discussion topics from the 2025 Business Meeting, the host rotation, new business, discussion of the Conference Policy and Procedures document as needed, and other topics specific to the ASCE Gulf Coast Student Symposium.

Each student delegate must be a member in good standing with their student chapter and ASCE. Each student chapter in the Student Conference has one vote. **At least one member of your ASCE student chapter must participate in the Business Meeting as part of the eligibility requirements to advance to finals for Concrete Canoe, Steel Bridge, Sustainable Solutions, and Surveying.**

STUDENT SYMPOSIUM

PAPER COMPETITION

The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career. The competition consists of a paper submission and a presentation at the student symposium. The topic for the 2026 ASCE Gulf Coast Student Symposium Paper Competition: Daniel W. Time Limit for Presentations: 5 minutes per presentation + 5 minutes for Q&A

***All papers must have a statement at the bottom attesting that, except where otherwise cited, the submission is the work of the student author and not AI or NLP. Submissions without this statement will not be considered for recognition.*

For student chapters participating in their regional student symposium, papers must be submitted to the student symposium host by March 1, 2026, using the host's preferred submission process as outlined above. A separate submission to ASCE is not required for the Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students Competition, as the student symposium submission will serve as the official entry for both the Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Mead Paper Competition. The winning paper from each student symposium will advance to the Society competition for final review, with the official national winner announced in May 2026.

SOCIETY-WIDE FINALS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

Both the Student Symposium Paper Competition submission and the presentation are mandatory for any ASCE Student Chapter participating in the 2026 ASCE Gulf Coast Student Symposium that wishes to be eligible to advance to ASCE Society-wide finals competitions and the SSBC National Finals. Competitions requiring participation include:

- ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition,
- ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition,
- ASCE UESI Surveying Competition, and
- AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition.

Note: Any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

ASCE Society Competition Eligibility Requirements

Competitions that advance to an **ASCE Society-Wide Finals** competition include the ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, and ASCE UESI Surveying Competition. The AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility requirements below. See [SSBC Rules](#) for more information.

The purpose of student competitions is to provide student members career-enrichment opportunities to gain **hands-on, practical experience and leadership skills**. Society Competitions are an important and special opportunity to showcase the **engineering and professional skills** of student teams. As such, mutual respect is required for all stakeholders, including competitors, judges, hosts, and guests. Invitations to the Student Symposia and the Society-wide finals competitions/ASCE Civil Engineering Student Championships are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in sanctions, disqualifications, and loss of invitations. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide finals competitions are more stringent than the requirements for participation at the student symposia competitions.

Eligibility for Student Symposium Competition

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters to compete at the Student Symposia Competitions:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, **no later than the start of their Student Symposium**.
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report or EZ Annual Reporting Form **no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST**.

Eligibility for ASCE Society-wide Finals Competition

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters in order to advance to the ASCE Society-wide Finals Competitions:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's **full Annual Report, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST**, and have received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100. **Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify** to advance to competition finals; and
2. Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:
 - a. On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.
 - b. Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

ASCE Geo-Wall Competition

Design an MSE wall using the least amount of reinforcement needed to support the retained soil and the designed surcharge loads.

Will It Tornado?

Student will design a concrete panel to survive the impact of a 2x4 traveling at 150 MPH.

PCI Prestress Mini-Beam

Design and construct a precast, prestressed concrete beam using bass guitar strings in place of traditional seven-wire steel strands. Cast and test the beam.

Balsa Wood Bridge

Design and construct a lightweight bridge using the provided balsa wood and adhesive, following strict dimension limits, to carry the maximum possible load until failure.

All About That Phase

Design an intersection timing plan for a complicated campus location. Update your plan mid-competition given an unexpected change.

Cardboard Chair
