Business Meeting (*Eligibility Requirement*)

The Business Meeting is tentatively scheduled for **Saturday, April 5, 2025, at 5:00 p.m.** Watch for the draft business meeting agenda emailed to student chapters for review before the symposium.

The business meeting is the annual meeting of the Student Conference Board of Delegates. The Board of Delegates consists of two student delegates (*preferably a senior or junior in an ASCE leadership position and a sophomore in or aspiring to an ASCE leadership position*) and the faculty advisor from each student chapter.

The draft agenda will include unresolved discussion topics from the 2024 Business Meeting, the future host rotation, new business, the discussion and finalization of the Conference Policy and Procedures document, and other topics specific to the ASCE Indiana-Kentucky Student Conference Region.

Each student delegate must be a member in good standing with their student chapter and ASCE. Each student chapter in the Student Conference has one vote. **At least one member of your ASCE student chapter must participate in the Business Meeting as part of the eligibility requirements to advance to finals for Concrete Canoe, Steel Bridge, Sustainable Solutions, and Surveying.**

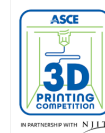

Dr. Kenneth Lauer Student Symposium Paper Competition

In 2025, the ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition will be named in honor of Dr. Kenneth Lauer, a former professor from the Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering & Earth Sciences at the University of Notre Dame. Thank you to G.L. Pang, whose sponsorship covered the naming rights for the competition.

The **Dr. Kenneth Lauer** Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career. The competition consists of a paper submission and a presentation at the student symposium.

The topic for the **Dr. Kenneth Lauer** Student Symposium Paper Competition is the same topic as the [Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students](#). However, the **Dr. Kenneth Lauer** Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students are two separate competitions and **must be submitted separately**.

The **Dr. Kenneth Lauer** Student Symposium Paper Competition paper is due March 7, 2025, at 11:59 PM EST and must be submitted to 2025asceinky@gmail.com.

The **Dr. Kenneth Lauer** Student Symposium Paper Competition presentation is due April 2, 2025, at 11:59 PM EST and must be submitted to 2025asceinky@gmail.com.

The [Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students](#) is due March 1st and must be submitted to student@asce.org.

*****SOCIETY-WIDE FINALS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT*****

Both the paper submission and the presentation are mandatory for any ASCE Student Chapter participating in the 2025 ASCE Indiana-Kentucky Student Symposium that wishes to be **eligible to advance to ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals**. Both the paper submission and presentation **are required** in order to participate in the following society-wide finals competitions:

- ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition
- ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition
- ASCE UESI Surveying Competition, and
- AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition.

NOTE: Any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

ASCE Society

Competition Eligibility Requirements

Competitions that advance to an ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals include the ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, and ASCE UESI Surveying Competition. The AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility requirements below. See [SSBC Rules](#) for more information.

The purpose for student competitions is to provide student members career-enrichment opportunities to gain hands-on, practical experience and leadership skills. Society Competitions are an important and special opportunity to showcase the engineering and professional skills of student teams. As such, mutual respect is required for all stakeholders, including competitors, judges, hosts, and guests. Invitations to the Student Symposia and the ASCE Student Civil Engineering Championships/Society-wide Competition Finals are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in sanctions, disqualifications, and loss of invitations. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide competition finals are more stringent than the requirements for participation at the student symposia competitions.

ELIGIBILITY FOR STUDENT SYMPOSIUM COMPETITION

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters to compete at the Student Symposia Competitions:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, **no later than the start of their Student Symposium.**
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report or EZ Annual Reporting Form **no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.**

ELIGIBILITY FOR ASCE SOCIETY-WIDE COMPETITION FINALS

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters in order to advance to the ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's **full Annual Report, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST, and have received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100. Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify** to advance to competition finals; and
2. Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:
 - a. On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.
 - b. Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

Hotel Information

As stated in Mailer 1 and 1.5, please note that the University of Notre Dame’s “The Rally” weekend for admitted students will be the same weekend as the 2025 ASCE Indiana-Kentucky Student Symposium. This will entail approximately 2,000 admitted students and their families visiting South Bend. The University of Notre Dame has already begun reserving hotel rooms near campus. - A school's submission must be at most two pages in length.
 - Font size must be at least 10 pt font.
 - Margins must be at least 0.5 inches on all four sides.
 - Line spacing must be at least single-spaced.
 - All other formatting decisions are left to the discretion of the authors.
- Submissions are due by March 15th, 2025, via email to 2025asceinky@gmail.com.
- The event(s) that is being submitted must have occurred from April 15, 2024, through March 15, 2025.
- The host school will select the winner according to the following criteria (please highlight these areas in your submission):
 - Impact on the local community
 - *Make a case for how you measured the impact of your event(s)*
 - Number of student chapter members who participated
 - *Provide the size of your student chapter to allow the judges to evaluate the percentage of student engagement.*
 - Inclusivity of the event(s)
 - *Outline how your event was inclusive of your entire community*
 - Public engagement
 - *Outline how many individuals from the public were involved and/or impacted by your event(s).*
 - Partnerships with industry
 - *Outline if and how you engaged with industry partners in your event(s)*
 - Creative & Innovative
 - *Outline the uniqueness of your event(s)*
