

STUDENT SYMPOSIUM PAPER COMPETITION (<u>ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT</u>)

This is a mandatory paper submission and presentation for any student chapter participating in the 2024 ASCE Intermountain Southwest Student Symposium that wishes to be <u>eligible to advance to</u> <u>ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals</u>. Competitions **requiring** this include:

- ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition
- ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition
- ASCE UESI Surveying Competition
- AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition. '

The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career.

Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the of the ASCE Student Chapter, is a requirement to be eligible to advance to an ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals.

Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

The topic for the 2024 Intermountain Southwest Student Symposium Paper Competition is the same topic as the <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u>. However, the Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students are two separate competitions and **must be submitted separately**. The <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u> is due March 1st and submitted to <u>student@asce.org</u>. Submission details for the Student Symposium Paper Competition will be announced closer to the symposium.

ASCE SOCIETY-WIDE COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Competitions that advance to an ASCE Society-wide Competitions Finals include: ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, and ASCE UESI Surveying Competition. The AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility requirements below. See <u>SSBC Rules</u> for more information.

Invitations to Student Symposia and ASCE Student Civil Engineering Championships/Society-wide Competition Finals are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in letters of reprimand, mandatory behavior management plans, and loss of invitations to further competition for individual institutions and/or entire conferences. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide competition finals are more stringent than the requirements for participation at the student symposia competitions.

Eligibility for Student Symposium Competition

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters to compete at the Student Symposia Competitions:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

- 1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than the start of their Student Symposium.
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report (required for advancement to national competitions) or EZ Annual Reporting Form no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.

Eligibility for ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters in order to advance to the ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

- 1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
 - a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.
 - b. Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST and have received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100. Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify to advance on to competition finals; and



ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS CONTINUED

- **2.** Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:
 - **a.** On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.
 - b. Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

TENTATIVE SYMPOSIUM SCHEDULE & HOTEL INFORMATION

Hotel Information:

Utah State University has extremely limited parking. Parking will **not** be validated for every vehicle from each attending student chapter. <u>Cache Valley Transit District</u> provides free public transportation to and from campus. We recommend utilizing this service and choosing a hotel along the southern part of the Blue Loop Route. A few hotels in this area include:

A Note on Weather:

Logan, Utah, is located 4,500 ft above sea level in northern Utah. In previous years, Logan has received snow around the time of the Intermountain Southwest Student Symposium. Chances are good that it will be cold and potentially snowy. We recommend those attending the symposium to keep an eye on the weather as the symposium approaches and to dress accordingly. **We highly encourage Concrete Canoe teams to wear wetsuits**. Based on previous years, the weather will meet the minimum temperature requirements for the races to be held, but the water *will* be cold.
