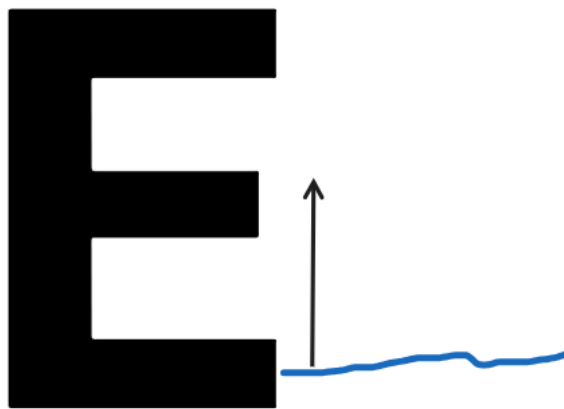

Answers to Questions from Captains Meeting:

How will freeboard assessment during co-ed races be conducted?

A: As outlined in 6.2, the Head Judge and at least 1 other judge will conduct a visual evaluation for compliance. Compliance will generally be evaluated as such: if at least half of the bottom portion of canoe or school name letters appear under water, penalty will be applied. Judges will take wind/waves into consideration and report findings, thus signifying the end of the compliance check and that a team may set off for the co-ed race.



If a boat begins co-ed race without waiting for compliance check, 30 second penalty will also be applied.
