## **Construction Institute Competition Information**

George Mason University is excited to host the ASCE Construction Institute Pilot Competition and would like to invite all schools to compete!

#### Why compete in the ASCE Construction Institute Competition?

This competition also has no prep work or any preplanning prior to the day of the competition so it will not interfere with the usual competitions like concrete cance and steel bridge. The real-world project documents for the scope of work will be handed out (digitally) during the scheduled time slot at the student symposia. No work or information will be given out to registered teams prior to the competition weekend, so the whole competition will take place at the symposia. The competition duration is three hours plus one additional hour for a presentation component.

#### What's the project this year?

Participating students will receive a focused scope of work for one real-world engineering project and will then be tasked to solve various construction-related challenges related to that project. Performing calculations, writing short answer responses, or gathering other forms of documentation will be required for each challenge.

Before registering, make sure you meet the ASCE Eligibility Standards (linked in Section 3.1 of the rules).

### **Regional Competition Rules:**

### ASCE's Got Talent

ASCE's Got Talent is here to allow competitors to take a break from the engineer's mindset and allow ASCE student members to show off their non-engineering skills and talents.

Judges will grade based on originality, quality, stage-presence, appropriateness, and overall engagement.

Rules:

- 1. Performers must be a part of ASCE and a part of one of the competing school's chapters. No outsiders will be allowed to participate.
- 2. Three entries will be allowed per school. These can be solo performances or group performances for up to ten people.
- 3. Performances must be safe and family friendly no profanity, violence, or any explicit content is allowed. One or two offenses can lead to a reduction in points and repeated offenses can result in a disqualification for your performance group.
- 4. Time limit will be up to 7 minutes. You can go over a maximum of 10 seconds. Any more will result in a reduction of points.
- 5. Acts must provide their own props. Nothing will be provided except audio equipment (microphone).
- Please have an idea of your performance and email it to <u>asce@gmu.edu</u> for approval by March 30<sup>th</sup>.
  Once approved, please stick to that performance for the competition. If your idea was rejected, come up with another and send it to the aforementioned email address.
- 7. The decisions made by judges or the show's management in setting rules or evaluating a performance are usually considered final and are not subject to complaint or alteration.







## ASCE Competition Eligibility Requirements

Competitions that advance to an ASCE Society-wide Competitions Finals include: ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, and ASCE UESI Surveying Competition. The AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility requirements below. See <u>SSBC Rules</u> for more information.

Invitations to Student Symposia and ASCE Student Civil Engineering Championships/Society-wide Competition Finals are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in letters of reprimand, mandatory behavior management plans, and loss of invitations to further competition for individual institutions and/or entire conferences. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide competition finals are more stringent than the requirements for participation at the student symposia competitions.

## **Eligibility for Student Symposium Competition**

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters to compete at the Student Symposia Competitions:

#### An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:

- a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than the start of their Student Symposium.
- **b.** Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report or EZ Annual Reporting Form **no later than February 1**, **11:59 p.m. EST.**

# Eligibility for ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters in order to advance to the ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals:

#### An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:

a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.
 b. Have submitted their student chapter's <u>full Annual Report</u>, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST <u>and have</u> received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100. Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify to advance on to competition finals; and

2. Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:

**a.** On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.

**b.** Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

## Student Symposium Paper Competition (Eligibility Requirement)

This is a mandatory paper submission and presentation for any student chapter participating in the 2024 ASCE Mid-Atlantic West Student Symposium that wishes to be eligible to advance to ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals. Competitions <u>requiring</u> this include: ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, ASCE UESI Surveying Competition, and AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition.

The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career.

Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter, is a requirement to be eligible to advance to an ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals.

Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

#### The topic for the ASCE Mid-Atlantic West Student Symposium Paper Competition is the <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize</u> for Students topic

#### Submission deadline is: March 15, 2024

Submission email/link is: 2024 ASCE Mid-Atlantic West Paper Competition Submission

This topic is the same topic as the <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u>. However, the Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students are <u>two separate competitions and must be submitted</u> <u>separately</u>. The Student Symposium Paper Competition paper is due March 15 and submitted through the above submission link. The Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students is due March 1<sup>st</sup> and submitted to <u>student@asce.org</u>.







## Business Meeting (*Eligibility Requirement*)

The Business Meeting is tentatively scheduled to take place on **Friday, April 12, 2024 at 5:00pm**. Keep an eye out for the draft business meeting agenda that will be distributed to student chapters for review before the symposium.


Note that the business meeting is officially the business meeting for the Student Conference Board of Delegates. The Board of Delegates consists of two student delegates (preferably a senior or junior in an ASCE leadership position and a sophomore in or aspiring to an ASCE leadership position) and the faculty advisor from each student chapter. Each student delegate must be a member in good standing with their student chapter and the Society. Each student chapter in the Student Conference has one vote. At least one member of your ASCE student chapter must participate. (See eligibility requirements.)

## ASCE Global Headquarters Parking Lot Tour

As you're heading to George Mason University for registration and the start of the Mid-Atlantic West Student Symposium on April 11<sup>th</sup>, consider adding a stop and coming to ASCE Headquarters for a tour of ASCE's sustainable parking lot.

The headquarters parking lot was renovated in 2020 using low-impact development practices to reduce outflow and to improve stormwater quality discharged to the Difficult Run watershed, which drains into the Potomac River and eventually into the Chesapeake Bay. Learn about the sustainable design solutions used such as recycled tires augmented asphalt pavement and stormwater management through a low impact bioretention system, biofiltration system, and permeable pavers.

The tour is limited to the first 60 people (students and faculty advisors) who sign up for the event in the student symposium individual registration form. A note will be added to the student symposium website when this event is at capacity.
