#### **Student Symposium Paper Competition**

Participation is a requirement for advancement to Society-wide finals competitions and SSBC National Finals.

#### **Water Treatment Competition**

Teams design and build a water filtration system that treats contaminated water to meet safe drinking standards under real-world constraints.

Rules Available: End of October/Early November

#### **Transportation** Competition

Students solve a transportation engineering problem, such as traffic flow, planning, or safety, using data analysis and innovative design solutions.

Rules Available: Within this week

#### **Geowall Competition**

Competitors design and construct a mechanically stabilized earth (MSE) retaining wall with paper reinforcement to support heavy loads without failure.

# **ASCE Society Competition Eligibility Requirements**

The ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, and ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, advance to ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals. The ASCE/AISC Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility criteria below. See SSBC Rules for more information.

The purpose of student competitions is to provide members with career-enriching opportunities to gain hands-on, practical experience and leadership skills. Society competitions are an important and special opportunity to showcase the engineering and professional skills of student teams. As a result, mutual respect is required for all stakeholders, including competitors, judges, hosts, and guests. Invitations to the Student Symposia and the ASCE Student Civil Engineering Championships/Society-wide Competition Finals are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in sanctions, disqualifications, and loss of invitations. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide competition finals are more stringent than the requirements for participation at the student symposia competitions.

### **Eligibility for ASCE Student Symposium Competition**

To compete at the Student Symposia Competitions, an ASCE Student Chapter must:

- 1. Pay their annual membership dues no later than the start of their Student Symposium and
- 2. Submit their student chapter's full Annual Report or EZ Annual Reporting Form no later than February 1st at 11:59 PM EST.

### **Eligibility for ASCE Society-Wide Competition Finals**

To advance the ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals, an ASCE Student Chapter must:

- 1. Be in good standing with ASCE by:
  - a. Paying their annual membership dues no later than February 1st at 11:59 PM EST and
  - b. Submitting their student chapter's <u>full Annual Report</u>, no later than February 1st, 11:59 PM EST, and have received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100. Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify to advance to competition finals; and
- 2. Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:
  - a. On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.
  - b. Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers or presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Paper Competition.

# Student Symposium Paper Competition

The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career. The competition consists of a paper submission and a presentation at the student symposium.

\*\*All papers must have a statement at the bottom attesting that, except where otherwise cited, the submission is the work of the student author and not AI or NLP. Submissions without this statement will not be considered for recognition.

For student chapters in Regions 1-9 participating in their regional student symposium, papers must be submitted to the student symposium host by March 1, 2026, using the host's preferred submission process as outlined above. A separate submission to ASCE is not required for the Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students Competition, as the student symposium submission will serve as the official entry for both the Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Mead Paper Competition. The winning paper from each student symposium will advance to the Society competition for final review, with the official national winner announced in May 2026.

### \*\*\*\*\*SOCIETY-WIDE FINALS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT\*\*\*\*

Both the Student Symposium Paper Competition submission and the presentation are mandatory for any ASCE Student Chapter participating in the **2026 ASCE Mid-Pacific Student Symposium** that wishes to be <u>eligible to advance to ASCE Society-wide finals competitions and the SSBC National Finals</u>. Competitions <u>requiring</u> participation include:

- ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition
- ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition
- AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition.

Note: Any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.
