First place teams will continue to be able to advance to the in-person Society-wide finals held at Louisiana Tech University from June 3rd-5th, 2022.

Symposium Format

The Symposium will now be held completely online. To accommodate this change, some competition rules are being updated. These adapted rules will continue to allow winning teams to advance to in-person Society-wide finals held at Louisiana Tech University from June 3rd-5th, 2022. Please see the Competition Rules section for details.

Each registered school will receive a package with items to be distributed to each individual participant after registration is completed.

Registering at Another Symposium

Some participant schools may be interested in registering at another symposium to participate as a **guest school** in their in-person competitions, such as the Intermountain Southwest Student Symposium or the Rocky Mountain Student Symposium. A full list of all student symposia is here. Schools registered as guests at another symposium may remain registered in the Pacific Northwest Student Symposium or cancel registration with us. If your school wishes to register at another symposium and/or cancel registration at the Pacific Northwest Student Symposium, please immediately email us at ubc.asce@gmail.com. Please consider the following:

- Advancing to Society-wide finals at Louisiana Tech University is possible only by participating virtually in the Pacific Northwest Student Symposium.
- Participant schools wishing to transfer are themselves responsible for contacting and registering with other symposium hosts.
- Registration as a guest school at another symposium is at the full discretion of the applicable host student chapter.
- Teams may participate in both the Pacific Northwest Student Symposium, to be eligible for advancement to Society-wide finals, and another symposium for the in-person experience as guests.
- For Steel Bridge only: teams may register in one regional competition only (see rules for details).

Individual participant registration fees are outlined below. Payment in CAD is preferred, but US schools unable to write cheques in CAD may instead pay the USD fees listed. Additional participants wishing to register after you have mailed your school's cheque may do so and will be charged the Late fees even if registering by February 25th.

Existing rules remain in effect and will be implemented using the *Virtual Scenario* adaptations where indicated. Unique submission links for each participating school will be sent out by email.

ASCE UESI Surveying Competition

Existing rules remain in effect with only Task 1 - Topographic Mapping to be carried out. Tasks 2-5 have been removed from the competition. Unique submission links for each participating school will be sent out by email.

Task 1A - Topographic Mapping submission deadline: February 28th

Student Steel Bridge Competition

The existing rules will no longer apply. A new set of rules adapted by AISC, anticipated to be similar to the Compete from Campus rules from 2021, will be shared with all schools as soon as possible.

Environmental (Water Treatment) Competition

Existing rules are retained with the only anticipated modification being that posters be submitted as PDFs instead of as physical boards.
