ASCE Competition Eligibility Requirements

Competitions that advance to an ASCE Society-wide Competitions Finals include: ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, and ASCE UESI Surveying Competition.

The ASC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSEC National Finals and follows the cligibility.

The AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility requirements below. See SSBC Rules for more information.

Invitations to Student Symposia and ASCE Student Civil Engineering Championships/Society-wide Competition Finals are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in letters of reprimand, mandatory behavior management plans, and loss of invitations to further competition for individual institutions and/or entire conferences. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide competition finals are more stringent than the requirements for participation at the student symposia competitions.

Eligibility for Student Symposium Competition

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters to compete at the Student Symposia Competitions:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

- 1. Be in good standing with ASCE:
- a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than the start of their Student Symposium.
- **b.** Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report or EZ Annual Reporting Form **no later than February 1**, 11:59 p.m. EST.

Eligibility for ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters in order to advance to the ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

- **1.** Be in good standing with ASCE:
- a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.
- b. Have submitted their student chapter's <u>full Annual Report</u>, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST <u>and have received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100.</u> Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify to advance on to competition finals; and
- 2. Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:
- **a.** On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.
- **b.** Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

Student Symposium Paper Competition (Eligibility Requirement)

This is a mandatory paper submission and presentation for any student chapter participating in the 2024 ASCE Rocky Mountain Student Symposium that wishes to be eligible to advance to ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals. Competitions <u>requiring</u> this include: ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, ASCE UESI Surveying Competition, and AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition.

The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career.

Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the of the ASCE Student Chapter, is a requirement to be eligible to advance to an ASCE Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals.

Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

The topic for the ASCE Rocky Mountain Student Symposium Paper Competition is the non-technical paper: Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students

Non-technical paper

This topic is the same topic as the <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u>. However, the Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students are two separate competitions and must be submitted separately. The Student Symposium Paper Competition paper is due Feb 28th and submitted to <u>asceuwyo@gmail.com</u>. The <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u> is due March 1st and submitted to student@asce.org.

The scoring sheet template for this paper is included in Appendix A (it is the same for both the Meade paper and the Technical paper)



Business Meeting (Eligibility Requirement)

The Business Meeting is tentatively scheduled to take place on Friday April 19th, 2024. Keep an eye out for the draft business meeting agenda that will be distributed to student chapters for review before the symposium.

Note that the business meeting is officially the business meeting for the Student Conference Board of Delegates. The Board of Delegates consists of two student delegates (preferably a senior or junior in an ASCE leadership position and a sophomore in or aspiring to an ASCE leadership position) and the faculty advisor from each student chapter. Each student delegate must be a member in good standing with their student chapter and the Society. Each student chapter in the Student Conference has one vote. At least one member of your ASCE student chapter must participate. (See eligibility requirements.)





Regional Competition Rules

Technical paper

Submission deadline: February 28th

In email subject line please include: SCHOOLNAME_Technical (i.e. UnivWyo_technical)

This paper and presentation competition are regional competitions. The topic for this paper is any topic related to Civil Engineering. This competition can be performed by a single individual or a team of no more than two students. Each chapter is eligible to submit a single technical paper. The technical paper is accompanied by a technical presentation that will be presented at the symposium.

Paper Guidelines:

- 1. Limited to 1 paper from each student organization
- 2. Not to exceed 2000 words in length
- 3. Can be written by individual or team of no more than 2 members

Presentation Guidelines:

- 1. Time limits set by schedule (TBD)
- 2. Can be presented by individual or team of no more than 2 members

The scoring sheet template for this paper is included in Appendix A (it is the same for both the Meade paper and the Technical paper)

This event will be held in the evening on Thursday April 18th, 2024, in the Engineering Education and Research Building (EERB).


Overall Symposium Competition Winner (New !!)

Laramie is a small town (approx. 30,000 people) with a number of hotels as shown below. Laramie is small enough that travel by vehicle to and from the Rochelle Gateway Center should not require more than 10 minutes no matter what hotel is chosen. **HOWEVER**, hotels fill quickly and if they are not booked in advance they may fill to capacity. You are recommended to book hotels as soon as possible to ensure that you and your team will not have to commute from Cheyenne (which is the next closest city, a 50-minute drive to Laramie)

The 2024 ASCE Rocky Mountain Student Symposium includes a total of 8 competitions, as listed below:

ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition
AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition
ASCE UESI Surveying Competition
ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition
Timber-Strong Design Build Competition
Student Symposium Paper Competition (Meade Paper)
Technical Paper Competition
Mystery Design Competition

For the purpose of determining the 2024 ASCE Rocky Mountain Student Symposium champion, points will be awarded as follows;

Participates in any competition* – 1 point

Placing 3rd in any competition – 2 points

Placing 2nd in any competition – 3 points

Placing 1st in any competition – 4 points

This type of point system should work to reward chapters who try and compete in every event regardless of placement and doesn't give weight to competitions that require more resources than others. Overall, 2024 ASCE Rocky Mountain Student Symposium 1st, 2nd and 3rd place will be awarded plaques.

Scoring Example:

If a student chapter competes in the concrete canoe competition and places 2nd they will be awarded 4 points (3 points for placing 2nd and 1 point for participating).

*Mystery Design historically includes multiple people from each student chapter. If even a single participant from a student chapter participates the student chapter will be awarded 1 point (participation). In the case of Mystery Design when a team consists of participants from multiple universities the winning team will score 4 points for their student chapter (i.e. student A and student B win mystery design, then both university A and university B will be awarded 4 points. In the event that student A and student B are from the same university, that university will still only be rewarded 4 points.)

**In the event of a tie for competition placements the points awarded will be summed and divided evenly between tied teams (i.e. CU Boulder and Wyoming tie for 1st place in the Steel bridge competition with SDSM getting 2nd place: in this case CU boulder and Wyoming would take the points from 1st and 2nd place and divide them, then SDSM would revise the 3rd place points).

CU Boulder: 3.5 + 1 = 4.5 points Wyoming: 3.5 + 1 = 4.5 points

SDSM: 2 + 1 = 3 points
