The online form* must be completed by the team captain and faculty advisor(s). Each entity will submit a separate form. * Concrete Canoe forms can be found in the 2025 ASCE Concrete Canoe Request for Proposal Rules. Concrete Canoe forms submitted after November 1, 2024, at 5:00 pm Eastern will be considered late submissions and subject to deduction. Business Meeting (Eligibility Requirement)

The Business Meeting is tentatively scheduled to take place on Saturday, April 12th, 2025 at 5:30 pm. Watch for the draft business meeting agenda that will be distributed via email to student chapters for review before the symposium.

The business meeting is the annual meeting for the Student Conference Board of Delegates. The Board of Delegates consists of two student delegates (*preferably a senior or junior in an ASCE leadership position and a sophomore in or aspiring to an ASCE leadership position*) and the faculty advisor from each student chapter.

The draft agenda will include unresolved discussion topics from the 2024 Business Meeting, the future host rotation, new business, the discussion and finalization of the Conference Policy and Procedures document, and other topics specific to the ASCE Upstate New York-Canada Student Conference Region.


Each student delegate must be a member in good standing with their student chapter and ASCE. Each student chapter in the Student Conference has one vote. At least one member of your ASCE student chapter must participate in the Business Meeting as part of the eligibility requirements to advance to finals for Concrete Canoe, Steel Bridge, Sustainable Solutions, and Surveying.

Local Competition Information

Student Symposium Paper Competition

The ASCE Student Symposium Paper Competition emphasizes the importance of being able to write and present a paper as essential communication skills for all engineers and often necessary for advancement in your career. The competition consists of a paper submission and a presentation at the student symposium.

The topic for the 2025 ASCE Upstate New York-Canada Student Symposium Paper Competition is:

Topic: Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students (*click here for the 2025 topic*) **Submission deadline:** March 1st, 2025 **Submission email:** ASCE@westpoint.edu

This topic is the same topic as the <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u>. However, the Student Symposium Paper Competition and the Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students are two separate competitions and **must be submitted separately**. The Student Symposium Paper Competition paper is due March 1st and submitted to <u>ASCE@westpoint.edu</u>. The <u>Daniel W. Mead Prize for Students</u> is also due March 1st and submitted to <u>student@asce.org</u>.

Richard H. Scranton Outstanding Community Service Competition

The Richard H. Scranton Community Service Award is awarded to the chapter that demonstrates the strongest engagement in the community with projects that provide great value to and impact on their local community while engaging a large number of chapter members. This is an exciting opportunity for the ASCE Region 1 Student Chapters to showcase their community service efforts!

Student teams will submit a digital copy of the poster in advance to <u>ASCE@westpoint.edu</u> by April 1st, 2025 and bring the actual poster to the symposium highlighting their 2024 community service efforts. **Criteria for submissions will be posted on the student symposium website on February 13th, 2025**. Students should expect to prepare for judges to observe, evaluate, and hold a conversation with them to ask specific questions about their projects and the impact of their efforts. Student posters, projects, and oral responses will be evaluated, considering all community service projects documented as a body of work.

Each student chapter may submit one poster. One winner from the ASCE Upstate New York-Canada Student Symposium will be named the **Symposium Community Service Award Champion.** The champion will advance for final consideration for the Scranton Award by the Committee on Student Members.





*****Society-wide Finals Eligibility requirement*****

Both the paper submission and the presentation are mandatory for any ASCE Student Chapter participating in the 2025 ASCE Upstate New York-Canada Student Symposium that wishes to be <u>eligible to advance to ASCE</u> <u>Society-wide competition finals and SSBC National Finals</u>. Competitions <u>requiring</u> participation include:

- ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition
- ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition
- ASCE UESI Surveying Competition, and
- AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition.

Note: Any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.

ASCE Society Competition Eligibility Requirements

Competitions that advance to an ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals include the ASCE Concrete Canoe Competition, ASCE Sustainable Solutions Competition, and ASCE UESI Surveying Competition. The AISC/ASCE Student Steel Bridge Competition advances to the SSBC National Finals and follows the eligibility requirements below. See <u>SSBC Rules</u> for more information.

The purpose of student competitions is to provide student members career-enrichment opportunities to gain hands-on, practical experience and leadership skills. Society Competitions are an important and special opportunity to showcase the engineering and professional skills of student teams. As such, mutual respect is required for all stakeholders, including competitors, judges, hosts, and guests. Invitations to the Student Symposia and the ASCE Student Civil Engineering Championships/Society-wide Competition Finals are a privilege, not a right. Failure to act professionally can result in sanctions, disqualifications, and loss of invitations. Please note that the requirements for eligibility for Society-wide competitions.

Eligibility for Student Symposium Competition

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters to compete at the Student Symposia Competitions:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:

a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, **no later than the start of their Student Symposium**. b. Have submitted their student chapter's full Annual Report or EZ Annual Reporting Form **no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST**.

Eligibility for ASCE Society-wide Competition Finals

The following qualifications are required of all ASCE Student Chapters in order to advance to the ASCE Societywide Competition Finals:

An ASCE Student Chapter must:

1. Be in good standing with ASCE:

a. Have paid their annual dues, as received by ASCE, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST.

b. Have submitted their student chapter's <u>full Annual Report</u>, no later than February 1, 11:59 p.m. EST, <u>and</u> <u>have received a minimum score of 25 points out of a possible 100.</u> Student Chapters that submit an EZ annual reporting form do not qualify to advance to competition finals; and

2. Attend and participate in their assigned Student Symposium as shown through their school's:

a. On-time attendance and active participation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter at the Student Symposium Business Meeting.

b. Participation in the Student Symposium Paper Competition, including submission and presentation by a member of the ASCE Student Chapter. Note that any papers/presentations created for any other competition do not count as an entry into the Student Symposium Paper Competition.
